Our vision is to be the leading mid-tier surf lifesaving club on the Sunshine Coast, with zero fatalities within the flags

At the Annual Dinner and Awards night, I gave a quick synopsis, of what we have achieved in the 2015 – 2016 season.

In all areas which I will cover on, our successes is due to all you members that have contributed the time and effort, to allow Kings Beach to have been recognised by Surf Lifesaving Qld as the safest family beach in Queensland.

From the statistical data provided to us by Surf Lifesaving, we are one of the three top beaches visited on the Sunshine Coast.

To try to provide you with a sense of achievement that you all should be so proud of, I have set out below a synopsis of what I believe we have achieved this season.

Patrol on the Beach

Rescues 205 of which 89 were performed by Rescue Tube and 86 via IRB assistance

First Aide: 179 delivery of aide, of which there were 9 major wounds, 6 fractures and 1 heart issue

Patrol Hours 6,898 hours, which is a major increase on the previous season

Membership 264 juniors (juniors, cadets) and 162 active, award and long service members

Financial

This year we were able to repay to our own Foundation, a final payment of \$20,000 monies which we had to borrow a number of years ago.

Dormitories and Recreation room were finalised and air conditioning installed

Surf Sports

We were represented at the Aussie and other titles, where again we were well represented and successful

Constitution

This year following your approval at a special general meeting in 2015, we are now operating under a new Constitution and By Laws.

Supporters Club – Mets on Kings

Via a fantastic effort of the Board of this body and building subcommittee, we have now one of the most prestigious social facilities on the North Coast. Following months of delay by external parties, construction of the new deck that so many supporters have contributed to, has just commenced.

Development of Master Plans

Via financial assistance from the Sunshine Coast Council, we are in the process of developing master plans for both the Senior Clubhouse and the Boatshed / Junior / Lifeguard and Patrol building. This will allow us to grow and develop under a strategic plan agreed to by members and the Board.

Development of area in front of Pavilion and in front of senior clubhouse

The Sunshine Coast Council has been working with our Building Sub Committee, to beautify and develop all areas around the senior clubhouse.

MANAGEMENT – FINANCE AND PROPERTY

My report for 2015-2016 will be very similar to last year, as it was another year of consolidation for the Club.

The Management Committee agreed to make the expenses budget for 15/16 the same as the actuals for 14/15 and in the end we ended up pretty close.

Now that expenses are under control, the priority for the Club should be increasing revenue. Without any coordinated fundraising/sponsorship approach by the Club, our revenue has continued to fall over the past few years.

A summary of this year compared to last year is provided below:

Aside from the above, the club was also able to make a number of capital acquisitions throughout the season, which have been capitalized and will be depreciated over their useful life. Some of the items were purchased using grant funds or in kind donations.

I am also happy to advise that the Club has repaid the final \$20,000 to the Met Caloundra Foundation from the \$50,000 advance made to the Club in 2012/2013. We thank the Foundation for their understanding over the past 3 seasons.

In relation to donations for the new deck, these have now totaled \$111,550, which is sitting on the Balance Sheet as Income in Advance. The first stages of the deck have now commenced and the donations will be recorded as income in 2016/2017 once the deck is completed.

Thank you to Kay Blokkeerus for her assistance throughout the season.

I look forward to working with members to achieve our goals for the coming seasons.

MANAGEMENT - Club Captain

Stepping into the role of Club Captain after only one year of being a patrolling member was certainly a tedious and daunting task, however the support and encouragement from so many members made this transition flow as smoothly and efficiently as possible. I cannot thank you all enough for hours spent answering my questions, especially Nathan Steer for the countless emails and phone calls he has received from me. Your kindness and patience has not gone unnoticed.

The season started on the 19th September unfortunately with a closed beach for the entire day. This was not the way I had anticipated to start the season but public safety is paramount and there are rules to be followed. Prevention is a key skill in keeping the public safe on our glorious King's Beach, with an astounding 2995 preventative actions performed an immense amount of gratitude needs to be recognised to our devoted patrolling members of Metropolitan Caloundra Surf Life Saving Club.

Huge congratulations to all Patrol Captains and Vice Patrol Captains who have done an extraordinary job in supporting both myself and the addition of taking immensely proactive actions to make this season extremely easy to keep organised and managed. With this class act running the beach along with their patrol teams there is no denying why King's Beach was named the Best and the Safest Beach in Queensland by Surf Life Saving Queensland. With a slight decrease from last year our beach attendance totalled at 112,126 visits to King's Beach this season. With 219 rescues performed it shows the immense level of responsibility that is held on the shoulders of our fantastic patrolling members. It is not just rescues that our lifesavers are restricted to dealing with, as they also assisted with 185 First Aid cases that ranged from minor marine stings to major first aids. I am extremely proud of how well our members work under pressure when incidents that required advanced assistance from paramedics occurred.

There is one incident that needs to be mentioned as it showed great maturity and responsibility from one of our young SRC members Mitchell Ruddy. Mitch whilst having fun down at King's Beach on his body board during the week played a vital role in the rescue of a gentleman. Mitch noticed a man heavily disorientated and struggling to stay above the water. Mitch did not hesitate to swim straight to him and keep him above water whilst signalling fellow surfers and on duty lifeguards for assistance. It was found that the patient's lungs were filled with water showing just how serious this incident was and from this has made a full recovery. Without Mitch's incredible instincts the outcome may have gone down a different path which is why what Mitch did is such a testament of how life changing these skills are to the public and what it means to be a lifesaver. Mitch you should be extremely proud of your efforts and I look forward to your future development within the club.

On the 23rd January the patrol team 'Des Dwyer' were placed into a situation that was handled with vast responsibility and an extremely high level of teamwork. With less than favourable conditions 'Des Dwyer' began their 76 rescues in one shift with a mass rescue of approximately 20 people who had been caught in a flash rip that had arisen from large sets coming through. They handled the rescues exceptionally with proactive measures in place which included members on rescue boards and rescue tubes already in the water waiting for people to be swept out, with the IRB collecting people and returning them safely to shore. It needs to be noted that with these 76 rescues majority of them were more so deemed preventative rescues as the members of the public had not realised just how quickly they had been swept out, therefore had not called for help, yet. Congratulations are also in order for the afternoon patrol 'Muddies' with a total of 19 rescues performed in the afternoon. The high level of skill and management for both these teams is incredible and I thank you all for having the abilities to respond swiftly and efficiently to these incidents. That following evening I was told by many members of the public - with one in particular who had been rescued that day - by which they were all astounded with how well the lifesavers dealt with the rescues. From their perspectives the teams were organised, extremely competent, and their observation skills were paramount. Which was no surprise to me but made me extremely proud to be Club Captain of such a skilled club.

I also need to add that before patrol one morning a 75 year old gentleman suffered a cardiac arrest during his morning swim at King's Beach, I was in the office when a member of the public came in and asked for assistance. Unfortunately CPR was not successful and on behalf of Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC I pass on our sincere condolences to his family and friends.

The season would not be possible without the support of our sponsors and supporters who have donated to the club throughout the year. As a volunteering organisation we rely on these contributions to keep King's Beach safe so I thank you deeply for all of your kind support.

Furthermore the endless hours that our trainers and assessors have put in to create such informed and knowledgeable members is astonishing. Without their time, effort, and passion for surf lifesaving our club would not be successful like it is today, so thank you for being so passionate and helpful in the future development of our great club.

And lastly to all the patrolling members and their friends and families, thank you. Thank you for giving up your own time to assist with such a unique organisation. Thank you for putting in countless hours to learn, improve, and exhibit skills that saves lives. Without your comradery and passion for lifesaving the season would not be possible and every one of you all deserves to be recognised for your efforts this season, so again I thank you.

When going into a role that you know minimal information about there are always challenges that arise, with this past season being an incredible learning experience for me it is for this reason that I have decided renominate for Club Captain for the 2016/2017 Season. I would love to have the opportunity to enhance Met Caloundra's patrols and implement new strategies and ideas, so I hope that you would support me in possible future Club Captain endeavours.

I look forward to seeing you all on the beach from September for the 2016/2017 Season.

TRAINING AND ASSESSMENT - Chief Training Officer

Our club had a successful season in training new and existing members for awards. This is only possible due the hundreds of hours that our trainers and assessors dedicate to the cause. To all of you I say thanks.

In regards to our core lifesaving award, the Bronze Medallion, 30 members obtained the award this season, which was an increase from last season, but still not enough to increase our core patrolling numbers. We should be aiming for a minimum of 40 every year. In a positive sign for the future, we also had 35 members obtain the Surf Rescue Certificate, and I hope many of these members will obtain their Bronze in the coming years.

Most of these awards were obtained at our biggest ever Lifesaving Camp during the school holidays, where 50 members obtained numerous awards from Bronze Medallion, Surf Rescue Certificate, First Aid and Resuscitation. This was a great camp with a mixture of new and renewing, old and young members. Many friendships were made at the camp, and it is great to see so many of the attendees so heavily involved during the remainder of the season. Thanks to all those that made this camp a success and we hope the 2016 camp can be just as successful.

The Club is still struggling to find the resources to train IRB Crew and Driver awards. Despite this, we did have 2 members obtain the IRB Driver award and 10 obtain the IRB Crew award. We should be aiming to double this number in coming seasons.

All Emergency Care awards are now facilitated by SLSQ. Whilst this takes some of the burden away from Club training resources, we need to ensure that we still offer these courses to members on a regular basis. It was great to see 34 members obtain the First Aid award and 34 obtain the Resuscitation award.

We also had a number of members obtain specialist awards: Gold Medallion (2), Rescue Water Craft Operator (1), Basic Beach Management (6), Age Managers Course (10), First Aid facilitator (1), ATV Operator (5) and Advanced Resuscitation (7).

I look forward to working with everyone in the coming season.

JUNIOR ACTIVITIES – Chairman

The 2015-16 season, my first season as JAC Chairman, proved to be both challenging and most rewarding. I very much enjoyed getting to know more of the nippers and parents, especially those outside of the age groups of my own 3 kids. The challenge has been providing a program that caters for all interests and capabilities including lifesaving education and skills in providing a pipeline of future patrolling members, for those with a focus on surf sports competition and carnivals, or for those just looking to gain some basic surf skills and exercise on a Sunday morning.

First off, I would like to acknowledge Phill Ashworth, and the legacy he left during his time as JAC Chairman over the last many years (and of course his continued contribution in other capacities). The JAC has certainly strived to build upon the momentum created by Phill's leadership in previous seasons.

I think the nipper group has much to be proud of, and that we have made a positive contribution to Mets for both the present and the future. There have been many highlights during the season, as there are a number of acknowledgments I'd like to make:

People Our greatest assets are of course our nippers, the families that form the broader nipper group, and the positive culture that we enjoy. This season we have actively encouraged inclusiveness through family social events both at the Club and when travelling away to carnivals.

Membership We maintained strong membership numbers with over 234 Members. This season has again seen a large green cap group, which is a continuing trend over the last few seasons. It was great to see a re-building of nipper numbers in our older age groups, U11-15's, and the continued integration of U15's into nippers.

Parent Volunteers The level of parent support has been overwhelming in that a number of people invested their time during the season to participate in courses in order to act as Carnival Officials, Water Safety Officers, and Age Managers. Also, I'd like to acknowledge those parents who routinely assist in setting up / packing up the beach, help in the BBQ, and just roll up their sleeves to help out when required. To all of you...thank you! As we grow, we need this pool of resources to expand to allow us to continue to effectively offer the programs to our nippers.

Patrol Hours Well done to our U14 & 15's who achieved their SRC and Bronze Medallions respectively during the season. It is great to see our nippers start their transition into becoming patrolling members. Many of these kids racked up a huge amount of patrol and water safety hours over the season – I never cease to be impressed by the maturity and knowledge of these boys and girls whether it be in a rescue situation or just treating someone for a blue-bottle sting.

Surf Sports This season has seen another improvement in both results and participation levels for Mets nippers at U8-10 and U11-15 carnivals, which acknowledges the hard work from our coaches, Jeff Morris (water) and Kerry Barlow (beach). It was great to see our little U8-10's use the skills they have learnt and put that into practice, within a 'fun and participation' framework. The U11-15's had a hard time of it this season with weather either cancelling or interrupting a number of their carnivals. Despite this, Mets punched above their weight and enjoyed some great results at carnivals including at Sunshine Coast Branch and State Championship levels. With a 35 strong State team, we had lots of finalists, but special mention must go to our U12 boys who medalled in a number of events at States:

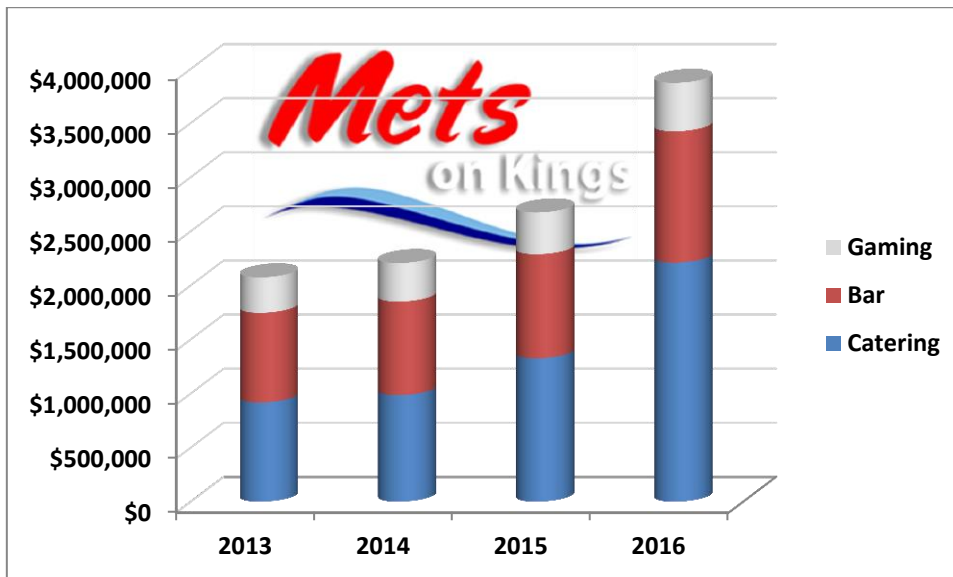


It's truly been an honour to have played some small role in this remarkable transformation.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2016

Note 1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Queensland). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

(a) Income Tax

The Club has received an exemption from income tax in accordance with Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

(c) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

(d) Employee Provisions

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(e) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(f) Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(g) Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(h) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2016

(i) Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

(j) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

(k) Accounts payable and other payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.
