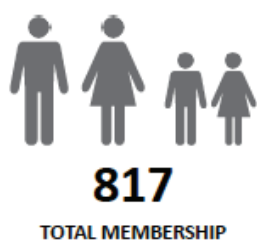

Our committees are a vital part of the governance and ongoing development of the Surf Club. I would like to thank the members of the following committees for all your work during the last year.

Fundraising and Grants: We now have a Fundraising and Grants Committee which has one of our Directors, Brent Hiley as its Chairperson and Kerry Barlow, Emily Hiley and Ben Mayes as members. The committee was put in place by the Board to provide a more coordinated focus on these vital revenue streams for the Club. I would like to thank Brent Kerry, Emily and Ben for taking on for the work they are doing in securing additional funds for our Club.

Foundation: The Foundation Committee consisting of Blake Andrews (Chairperson), Glen Forbes, Stephen Maitland and Simon Richards manage the funds invested for the ongoing development of our members. The Foundation currently has funds of \$314,582.61 with an investment target of \$500,000.

Building Committee: The Building Committee consisting of Ron Youels (Chairperson), John Brannock, Denis Croft, and Brian Wooldridge provide advice to the Board on building issues and have recently completed a structural audit of our clubhouse. The information provided by this audit will be used to put in place a costed asset management plan for the building

Our Achievements

New IT System: During the year we completed the commissioning of a secure cloud-based IT system to replace our old out-of-date server. The new system provides a secure environment for the storage of all the Club's records and member information. We now have all our records and critical processes online. This will provide ongoing continuity as the Club's officers change over time.

Boatshed Redevelopment: We are working with the Sunshine Coast Council in the development of the detailed design for the new boatshed. Although the design is at an advanced stage the timing for delivery is subject to the Council being able to secure enough funding. Brett

Magnussen is coordinating the Clubs needs and feedback with the Council and its architects

Offsite Storage: Out thanks go to Caloundra State School who have kindly provided the Club with the ground to build an offsite storage shed. We are currently awaiting the outcome of a grant application for funds to erect a

large shed on this site.

Property Management: The Clubhouse and Kiosk now have sub- lease agreements in place with the Supporter's Club that provide the necessary rights and protection of each party. Unfortunately, there is still no formal license agreement with the Council for the use of the Boatshed and we are endeavouring to formalise this arrangement to ensure the safety and protection of our members using this building.

Our Future

The Club is in a great position financially with an experienced and dedicated senior membership that is supported by a very strong junior membership. This bodes well for the future of our Club. However, we need to work together to ensure that we retain our emerging junior members. Unfortunately, the operation and running of our Club, too often falls upon the shoulders of a few of our dedicated members. Whilst I realise that we all have very busy lives outside Surf Lifesaving, I would ask that you consider how you may help any of our operation team in any small way. If we all do a little bit, it makes lifesaving fun for everyone.

I would like to thank everyone who has helped and supported me during my first year as President and more so all those members who make it very special in just being part of Metropolitan-Caloundra Surf Lifesaving Club.

CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Reflecting on the 2018/19 lifesaving season, I would like to say a sincere thank you to every active member who contributed to our primary function on patrols this season.

It was another successful season with no lives lost on our watch – mission accomplished!

This year we had a total of 208 active members clocking on for volunteer patrols. Collectively we patrolled for nearly 10,000 hours. We had 13 members who were on the beach for more than 100 hours each – thank you to you all for your commitment. Impressively we also had 90 members who completed at least 50 hours on patrol. This is a great sign of a growing core group of members who have a willingness to be heavily involved with our club and surf lifesaving in general.

I would like to thank all the patrol captains and

vice-captains in particular, for your leadership of our teams this year. Throughout the season it was only the rarest exception that we needed to find patrol members at the last minute. Patrol teams were almost entirely self-sufficient and this made my job much easier. It was really pleasing to see some inter-team rivalries becoming apparent, and it is obvious that many teams have a strong culture and bonds amongst their members.

A special thanks also to CTO Simon Richards and

all trainers and assessors who helped out during the season. We had 32 new Bronze members and 36 new SRC's added to our teams this season and their contribution to the club was significant. Many of these new members completed 50 or 100 hours in their first season. It's great to see their enthusiasm and as a club it is essential for our viability moving forward. We also had more than 50 new awards gained by existing patrol members. Just another measure of our commitment to ongoing learning and development.

I would like to extend a personal thanks also to the other members of the club's Operations Group – Brett Magnussen (JAC), Kirsten Phillips (Member Development) and Nathan Steer (Facilities & Equipment). Your contribution was amazing and essential as always to the ongoing function of our patrol teams.

With our growing membership we were able to add an extra patrol team to our roster this season. For this I would like to highlight the efforts of PC Jase Bean and VPC Dan Dwyer for their leadership of the Tiger Sharks patrol which contained a significant number of younger members. This group stepped up to the mark in a time of utmost need for one beachgoer who suffered a cardiac arrest following a near-drowning and spinal injury. The teamwork in a crisis situation that afternoon was something we can all be proud of as a club. Their efforts literally meant the difference between life and death for their patient. He has since gone on to make a nearly complete recovery from injuries which his doctors all said should have been fatal. It was also very satisfying to see the number of other club members who came down to help when the call went out. I commented last season that the greatest indicator of our success as a club is our people and this was an amazing demonstration of what we can do in a time of need.

From my perspective it has been an honour and a privilege to hold the position of Club Captain for the past 2 seasons. I will be stepping down for the present, but I sincerely hope that my successor finds this role as enjoyable and rewarding as I have. I hope that everyone has a safe and relaxing Winter, and I look forward to seeing you all again in 2018/19.



JUNIOR ACTIVITIES CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Brett Magnussen



The 2018-19 season, the 50th year of nippers for Surf Lifesaving Queensland, was another successful one for Mets Nippers. Congratulations to all of our nippers for their achievements this season.

On reflection, we have much to be proud of, including the following highlights.



Lifesaving: There was over 30 nippers who achieved their Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) award and were allocated to patrols, a great outcome and our key purpose in providing a pipeline of future bronzies / patrolling members. Whilst confronting at times, it was encouraging to see some of our kids (U14 & U15's) mature before our eyes through involvement in serious rescues and applying their lifesaving skills as part of their respective patrol teams.

Sustainability: Membership levels have grown to about 370 kids (U6 to U15) with strong numbers in our Green Caps and U8's. Our sustainability, underpinned by the Club's Strategic Plan, fundraising initiatives, and the support of the Club Operational Group, was facilitated through the uptake in parent volunteers, largely by way of our Family Participation Program.

Leadership: Over 20 of our U14 & U15's attended the Sunshine Coast Surf Lifesaving Camp Commando (leadership camp), the largest representation from any Club. Our older kids were engaged throughout the season in Youth Member Development activities including the Sunshine Coast Lifesaving Youth Ball and weekend education activities involving sleepovers in the Club dorms. Thank-you to our Nipper Captains, Yasmin Richters, Maddy Crowe, and Lily Taylor, who represented our Club at events such as the

50 Years of Nippers celebrations and inspired our young nippers throughout the season.

Surf Sports: Surf Sports participation increased again this season, and on the back of that there was improvement in results at Branch, State and National levels, as well as representation in Branch and Queensland teams. Additional pathways were introduced in Surf Sports (to facilitate better engagement and increased participation) including March Past teams, growing our Pool Rescue team (2nd season), and Surf Rescue (champion lifesaver) competition. Well done to everyone from U8's and up who competed during the season and represented our Club with great spirit.

Facilities: Council announced a commitment to the redevelopment of the Boatshed, which will provide much improved facilities for the nippers. The Club is currently working with the Council in the development of the detailed design, noting that the timing for delivery of the new facility is subject to funding.

Fun: We had a lot of fun along the way including events such as our Halloween Night, Christmas Twilight Nippers, Surf Sports Camp, Break-Up celebrations, and social gatherings when on trips away to carnivals.

I believe the future of the Club is bright given our great bunch of nippers, our family-oriented culture, together with a well-established framework and Junior Activities program designed to cater for a broad cross-section of interests and capabilities. This season, like seasons before, will see our U15's and their families move from nippers into the senior Club. With this, comes a requirement for succession planning relative to JAC and volunteer roles, particularly from our families with kids in the Green Caps to U10 ranks. Getting involved in nippers with your kids is so very rewarding – keep an eye out for our Nipper AGM in the coming months in confirming the Junior Activities Committee for season 2019/20, as the Club needs your help!

Competition Results:

A summary of the Surf Sports results for our nippers, individuals and teams, for the carnivals that we participated in during the season is included in the Club Competition Results. Please note that only results for the U11-U15 carnivals are recorded with placegetters for the top six places earning points for our Club (1st place receiving 6 points and so on through to 6th place receiving 1 point). The U8-U10 carnivals are non-competitive and are all about participation, preparing the kids for competition when entering the U11 age group.

Junior Activity Trophies and Awards:

Our Break-up and Presentation Day was held on 6th April 2019 where we celebrated the 2018/19 season, acknowledged the Junior Activity Committee and the legion of parent volunteers, and most importantly recognised our nippers for achieving their relevant SLSQ Award as well as handing out trophies for outstanding achievement. MEMBER DEVELOPMENT REPORT

Healthy and sustainable membership is key to success in any volunteer organisation. As such, it is great to see our club's membership trending in the positive again this season. In the past 12 months we have tried to put initiatives in place to help support various membership groups across the club.

On the youth front, we have worked hard to provide opportunities for our members to upskill, network and have fun. We started the season with a youth breakfast and a goal setting and pathways session which was exceptionally positive.

We then ran a number of SSS (Serious Surf Skills) training courses during the season aimed at upskilling our youth members including the start of season bronze camp, a first aid course with Laserforce session and an IRB crew course. The junior activities surf sports camp was again a great initiative for engaging our young members – well done to the JA team who deliver this.

This season we had our largest contingent of youth ever attend the Sunshine Coast Youth Development Program – Camp Commando at Currumbundi. Twenty of our U14 and U15 members took part the program, with Brittany Wassing also attending as a leader and Eliza Dreves and Apryl Cordingley as logistics support. The feedback from the group was exceptionally positive and our youth should be commended on how they represented the club! The club also had two representatives at the SLSQ Youth Excellence Program this season – well done to Brodie Tan and Samara Lee.

Well done also to Aleisha Edwards who this year represented the club at the SLSQ Leadership Excellence Program and who has been contributing considerable time to supporting training delivery within the club.

The success of our youth program would not be possible without the outstanding efforts of our nipper program and the way the JA leaders and age managers are shaping our young members for the future. The diversity of activities and opportunities for involvement being offered through our junior club is certainly helping to retain our members into the senior club. Initiatives such as the surf sports camp and implementing march past teams again this season certainly help.

Our patrol captains have also be integral to our success with many going above and beyond in ensuring our young members are encouraged and engaged in many facets of the club - most importantly they make sure our young members feel they are a valued team member. A number of our young members were involved in serious incidents and rescues on patrol this season, the maturity, professionalism and skills they displayed during these incidents are commended.

Our member development initiatives didn't stop with youth. Well done to Sharon Punter and Apryl Cordingley who this season attended the national Masterclass program in Adelaide. The operations group officers have also been integral to our success this season as member development works across all areas of the club. Shane, Nathan, Matt, Simon, and Brett - thank you for your support and assistance.

TRAINING REPORT

It has been another busy and demanding year for the club's relatively small but dedicated group of Trainers and Assessors. I would like to start by thanking everyone that assisted in whatever capacity during the season.

Once again, the September holidays' 'Lifesaving Camp' was well attended by trainees with 41 attending - 13 new Bronze Medallions (BM) and 28 Surf Rescue Certificates (SRC). A big "thank you" to all the trainers, water safety and other members that assisted during the seven-day camp. The feedback from members was fantastic.

We ran two more weekend BM/SRC course for the year (November and January) which resulted in 19 new BM and 8 SRC's. We also had 1 member complete the upgrade for the Certificate II in Public Safety. Congratulations to Aleisha Edwards who obtained her Training Officer Bronze Medallion award and to Robbie Howell who obtained his Assessor Bronze Medallion award.

Thanks to Kirsten Phillips and Eliza Dreves who organised some Serious Surf Skills ("SSS") Camps which were targeted at our youth members. These were generally held at the club over a weekend and included training for a specialist award as well as additional member development activities. The outcome of these camps was 12 First Aid awards and 6 IRB Crew awards.

Additionally, we had another 11 members obtain their First Aid award, another 8 obtain their IRB Crew award and 9 completed their Advanced Resuscitation award. Three members obtained their Silver Medallion Beach Management award and we had 1 new IRB Driver. We hope to run an IRB Driver course at the start of next season.

SLSA rebadged the ATV award to a new SSV (Side by Side Vehicle) award, and as we swapped our ATV for a new one around the same time, we were required to induct existing operators with the new vehicle. 66 members completed this induction.

The compliance framework associated with SLSQ being a Registered Training Organisation is constantly increasing, which is making it harder for our volunteer trainers and assessors. All of our assessors are required to attend a 3-day training course to maintain their qualifications for next season, which is a huge commitment.

Thank you to my wife Kerri and two young children for allowing me to spend the time required in this position.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The core operations of the Club did not significantly change in FY19. Our gross revenue increased slightly on prior year, whilst our gross profit was in line with prior year. Although we saw a slight fall in money raised from the SOS appeal, we were still able to raise \$15,000. Many thanks to Kerry Barlow and her team for their efforts. We also saw increases in membership revenue and nipper BBQ profit.

Although there was a 19% increase in operating expenses for FY19, this was in line with the approved budget and was offset by additional in-kind donations from the Supporters' Club. The major increase in operating expenses was for the Club's new IT system (donated by the Supporters Club) and surf sports.

Other income increased by \$37k mainly as a result of increased rent and in-kind donations from the Supporters Club. Total rent and donations from the Supporters Club increased from \$44,346 in FY18 to \$78,629 in FY19.

As such, the net surplus for FY19 was \$8,059 compared to \$18,838 in FY18.

It was great to see Brent Hiley take on the Fundraising and Sponsorship role within the club. Brent and his sub committee have commenced the process to increase our revenue across all areas and we hope to see some results from their efforts in FY20.

The Supporters' Club's existing banking facility with Westpac was due to renew on 30 June 2019, so both Boards decided to go to tender for the facility. Many thanks to Brent Hiley, Stephen Maitland and Matt Punter who joined me on the sub committee to prepare the tender document.

As a result of the tender, both Club boards agreed in May to restructure the facility and stay with Westpac. As a result, the Surf Club will be taking over the existing Supporters' Club facility of approximately \$425,000 with Westpac and the Club will also have additional funds to draw down on to assist with some building maintenance. The term of the loan has also been extended which has significantly reduced the minimum monthly payments required.

As a result of this, the Supporters' Club will be in a better position to pay a more realistic amount of commercial rent to the SLSC. With this rent, the SLSC has agreed to pay additional principal payments off the facility as well as allocating a percentage of the revenue to a building fund, equipment fund and the Club Foundation.

In addition, both Clubs have also agreed to transfer building assets of approximately \$420,000 from the Supporters Club to the SLSC. This amount represents the written down value of improvements to the building which were paid for by the Supporters' Club approximately 5 years ago. As the SLSC is the owner of the building and the Supporters' Club is a tenant, the SLSC is responsible for building improvements whilst the Supporters' Club is only responsible for leasehold improvements to their leased area.

These two significant structural reforms will greatly assist the long-term viability of both Clubs into the future. Finally, many thanks to Kay Blokkeerus for her assistance in the office during the year and to my wife and children for allowing me the time to undertake my role.

JUDICIARY COMMITTEE REPORT

Fortunately, once again there were no referrals to the Judiciary Committee this season

which reflects on the quality and stability of the membership and leadership of the Club.

I only wish my role was a public service appointment with commensurate salary superannuation benefits and a motor vehicle.

BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT

The role of the Building Committee is to lend advice to the Club Board on all relevant issues concerning the property assets the club uses.

The main focus of the Building Committee this year has been a review of the Club's principal asset – the Clubhouse building on the foreshore at 1 Spender Lane.

The Clubhouse's age and its exposure to the elements raised questions about its current structural integrity and its long-term use. Brian Wooldridge, a Structural Engineer, inspected the building and produced an extensive report in February 2019.

This report identified immediate concerns that required addressing and highlighted the need for a maintenance program to protect this "aged beauty". Overall though, Mr Wooldridge concluded the building was in a sound structural condition.

The Building Committee after reviewing the report produced for the Club Board a prioritised action list to be implemented to ensure the future use and integrity of the Clubhouse. The Club Board then accepted the Building Committee's resolution that a position of Asset Maintenance Coordinator be created with this role reporting directly to the Board. The Building Committee feels this plan will ensure the long -term viability of the Clubhouse as an asset.

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Queensland). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

Statement of Compliance

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Queensland), the basis of accounting specified by all Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of Accounting Standards AASB 101: *Presentation of Financial Statements*, AASB 108: *Accounting Policies*, *Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors* and AASB 1054: *Australian Additional Disclosures*.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs. They do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

(a) Income Tax

The Club has received an exemption from income tax in accordance with Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Class of Fixed Asset	Depreciation Rate
Buildings	5%
Plant and equipment	25%

(c) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

(d) Employee Provisions

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(e) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(f) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(g) Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(h) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

(i) Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

(j) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

(k) Accounts payable and other payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

Report on the Audit of the Financial Report

As part of an audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards, we exercise professional judgement and maintain professional scepticism throughout the audit. We also:



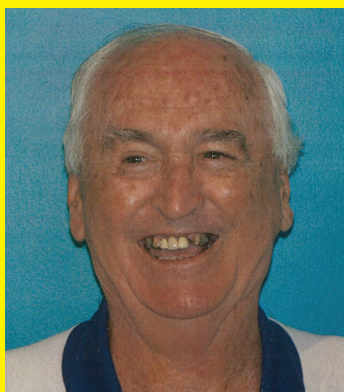

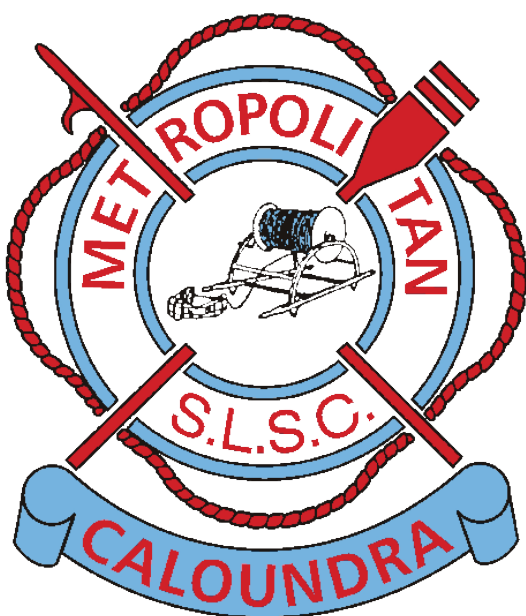
