At the annual general meeting on June 15, 2003, Metropolitan Caloundra Surf Life Saving Club members endorsed the life membership of John Blake Andrews.

Blake has had a long history with Metropolitan Caloundra dedicating an enormous amount of time to the club in the many positions he held.

Blake gained his Bronze Medallion at the club in the 1957-58 season and from that time became heavily involved in patrols and the running of the club. Blake completed plenty of hours on the beach hardly ever missing a weekend summer or winter.

At the start of the 1958-59 season, he completed his Instructor's Certificate and took on the positions of Deputy Surf Instructor and Deputy Gear Steward. In this season he was also awarded the title of Most Improved Member.

In the 1959-60 season Blake took on the position of secretary, a title he held for two seasons. In 1959-60 he also took on the job of North Coast Delegate.

The 1959-60 annual report reads:

"I would like to take this opportunity of paying tribute to the work of the Executive Officers during the year. More particularly, I would like to congratulate our Secretary Blake Andrews and our Club Captain Brian McCarthy. The administration of the Club under the guidance of Blake Andrews has functioned smoothly and efficiently."

From the start of the 1967-68 season until the 1969-70 season Blake again held the position of secretary. As well as being an exceptional administrator, Blake was also a keen surf lifesaver and competitor winning the B Grade handicapped surf race at the club championships in 1969-70.

From 1970 to 1972, Blake took a slight step back from the club working as the Assistant Secretary. More recently, Blake has used his financial expertise to help out as a member of the club's Foundation Committee.

Overall, Blake has been an extremely dedicated member of Met Caloundra, always giving 100 per cent in everything he does. His years of commitment and service to the club make him a worthy recipient of life membership.

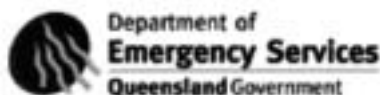

Another successful surf lifesaving season has drawn to a close with no loss of life on Kings Beach. Well done.

However, it has by no means been a quiet season for Met Caloundra's patrols. Club members completed 82 rescues during the season - 51 of these in the IRB and 19 with rescue tubes. More than 2300 preventative actions were also recorded during the season.

As well as rescues, patrol members managed 11 major first aid cases including a number of incidents during the busy nipper state titles. Members were also required to treat a number of spinal injuries on the northern rocks. However, the major first aid case of the year was the near-drowning of a surfer who had been surfing off the northern rocks. In this instance, the quick and brave response of Caloundra Mal Club members, and the efficiency of our patrolling members prevented a tragedy. This incident was handled exceptionally well - congratulations to all involved.

It should also be noted that the club's newest piece of rescue equipment - the boogie board - was used to assist with three rescues during the season and has encouraged many patrolling members to spend more time in the water. Well done also to Jimmy 'Santa' Creedy for his impromptu rescues during the nipper break-up which earned him a front page berth in The Sunshine Coast Daily.

In light of these efforts, I would like to sincerely thank all of the active patrolling members of the club who have given up their time this season to make Kings Beach a safer place. I have been continually amazed during the past 12 months at our members' willingness to voluntarily patrol the beach.

Overall, all of the rescue and first aid incidents encountered by our members this season have been handled efficiently and professionally and I congratulate all who have been involved.

Some major changes to patrolling were introduced this season including a rotating rostering system. This was mainly due to a reduced number of patrolling members and therefore fewer patrol teams. I realise that these reduced numbers put an extra burden on patrolling members, and I sincerely thank all of you for the efforts you have made to work within this system.

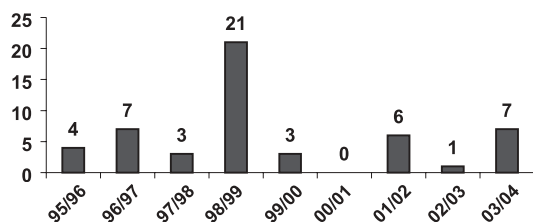

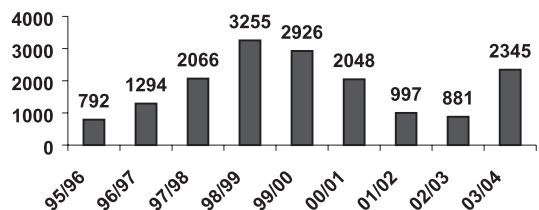

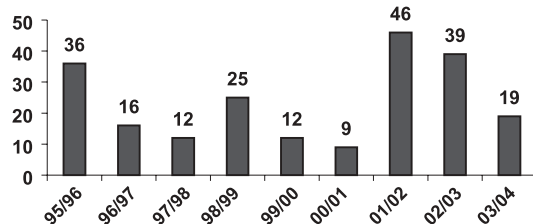
Rescues Without Rescue Gear



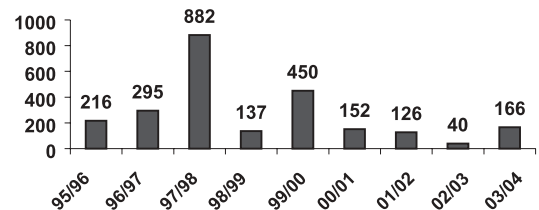

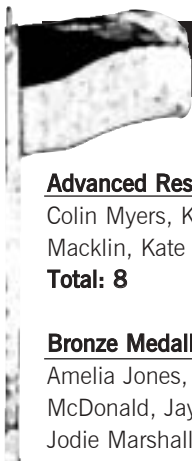

"The system" is changing and the interim period has been rather painful. SLSA has become a registered training organisation (RTO) which brings into line with the national training framework. In doing so the awards we gain as lifesavers can be now recognised in the workplace. This will be beneficial to some members in their field of employment.

Being an RTO means some changes in the way we train and examine. It also meant that every member wanting to be a trainer or examiner (now termed assessor) had to have a qualification to train and or assess, something that some members found hard to accept. The upside is that qualification is recognised in other sports and in the workplace.

Not only has this had an impact on our training but it had members thinking about the structure under which we work as an association. Accordingly I congratulate Simon Richards on his forward thinking and on the proposal he put forward to the Sunshine Coast Branch for a restructure in the manner in which the boards of lifesaving and surf sports worked. That proposal has been accepted and expanded in a proposed new representation structure and operation of these boards.

As training packages come on line in the coming season we will hopefully see a more consistent approach to the assessment of awards albeit more rigorous and more paperwork for the assessor.

This will impact across proficiencies and whilst it may seem tough on volunteers, the performance level will by necessity be higher. All this means for members is that they train for the swim components and practice for the resuscitation component so that they present as competent

members, not such a bad thing. Our resuscitation standard needs to be raised.

Should I be reappointed as club supervisor I intend to spend more time training the R&R teams started this season, and with the junior and senior clubs in the lifesaving competitions. For me this means not officiating at carnivals as there is not enough time for both.

As you know I swim almost every day and I would really like to see more ACTIVE members out in the water. That is what surf lifesaving is about.

As a club we lack some depth across most areas. Engaging some of the older members is one way other clubs have built that depth. Maybe we should give it a try?

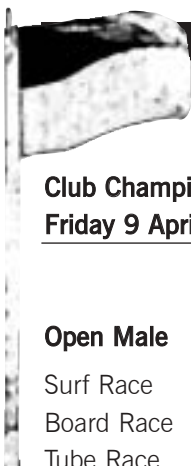

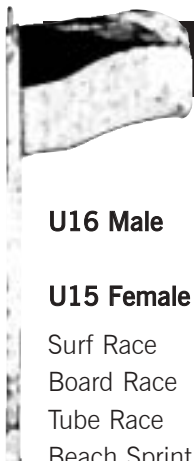

As another year closes and we start to realise how much time we really do have on our hands after training and carnivals, I hope to see all the same faces back again next year.

It gives me great pleasure to present to our members the 2004 Annual Report for the Metropolitan Caloundra Surf Life Saving Supporters Club.

The result for the year has been outstanding - a net profit of \$210,357 after depreciation, donations and management fees. This compares favorably to the comparable net profit reported last year of \$20,870.

Significant improvement has been made from last year as referred to by Tony Costain in his accompanying report. This has been achieved with very little in additional capital expenditure but largely through excellent management of costs and improved productivity.

I would like to congratulate Operations Manager Julie Richards, Assistant Manager Caren Prior and the rest of the team who have worked tirelessly to produce this excellent result. The entire Management Team at the RSL headed by Tony Costain and Steve Fromont should also be thanked for the countless hours they spend overseeing the club's operations and financial well-being.

The Supporters Club once again paid a management fee of \$100,000 to the Caloundra RSL which has been donated by the RSL back to the Surf Club. These funds are being set aside to assist with the impending redevelopment of the club.

We probably thought the same 12 months ago - but we now believe the club has reached its maximum potential with the facilities currently available. Any growth in profitability with the current facilities can only be incremental at best. For the first time we are in a position where our success rather than our desire dictates that we need a new clubhouse.

With this success also comes the ability to negotiate in real terms with builders, Council and financiers in the knowledge that a new clubhouse is a serious and achievable outcome.

In the past twelve months we have prepared a detailed Business Plan to support the construction of a new clubhouse; engaged club specialists to design a new club; and commenced serious negotiations with Caloundra City Council, the Department of Natural Resources and several banks to begin turning this long held ambition into a reality. I would like to thank Des Dwyer, Ken O'Connell and Steve Fromont for their tireless efforts in this regard.

Thank you to my fellow committee members this year for your support and dedication to the club and its ongoing development. Thank you also to the Caloundra RSL Management and Boards for the time and energy they have put into the continued success of our unique partnership. Particular thanks to Merv Horne and Bryan Costigan for their participation at Board level and work around the club.

On behalf of the Caloundra RSL Management Services team I am pleased to report on the 2003-2004 trading year's results.

The past 12 months have proven to be very progressive in the continual rebirth of the club. Systems, procedures and I believe service and quality standards are also now well embedded.

Financially, I also believe your club is now in a very sound financial position, especially in direct comparison to two years ago.

In relation to the trading results food and beverage have both continued on from last year with significant business growth.

Bar sales of \$676,476 produced a growth of \$60,449 or 9.81% on the previous year, while catering sales of \$608,063 produced a magnificent growth of \$126,913 or 26.40%.

Gaming was also positive at \$3,905,944, a growth of \$877,906 or 29%.

This resulted in a very pleasing net cash operating profit of \$381,199 up from last year's \$192,588 by \$188,642 or an annual cash operating profit growth of 98% on last year (prior to depreciation, loan repayments and other non-cash operating expenses).

These results would not have been possible without firstly, the direct efforts of Julie Richards and her highly dedicated team and secondly, the equally high quality working relationship between Matt Richards, his Committee and Club Management.

Congratulations to Matt and Simon and the rest of the guys - the level of support you have given to us has been exceptional.

As some of you may already be aware due to the financial operational upturn, planning is progressing at a

very positive rate on the eventual rebuilding of the Surf Club.

All going to plan this master plan development will be undertaken over the next couple of years and will then provide lifesaving and Supporters Club facilities the equal of any on offer in this country.

Finally to you the members I must thank you for your support, the RSL is very proud to be associated with Surf Lifesaving and we look forward to also being able to offer ongoing assistance in the future to what will become a facility we can all be justifiably proud of.
