Welcome to the 72nd Annual Report for the Metropolitan Caloundra Surf Life Saving Club.

Congratulations to all our volunteer members for your excellent efforts over the past twelve months. In particular I would like to make special mention of my fellow Board of Management members who have worked together as a great team during this period.

At the time of the issuing of our last Annual Report in June 2004 the Club did not have any professional staff. As reported at this time however, the Board of Management had taken a decision to undertake the employment of a number of full time staff. This was done with a view to creating a structure to take the Club to the next level and set the foundation for the next five to ten years.

We are pleased to be able to report to our members that the staff appointments made in the past twelve months has been successful.



Our Executive Officer Rob Barnes has delivered a level of professionalism to the management of the Club that exceeded most expectations. Rob has now accepted an offer to become national CEO of Australian Canoeing commencing in early June 2005. His appointment in this new role highlights the high calibre of management that has been working in our club. While Rob's departure is unfortunate from a club perspective we wish him all the best for the future.

Rob has during his time here at the club established some excellent systems and processes that will carry on in his absence. We are also actively seeking a replacement to carry on in Rob's position.

The Club also appointed Rhett Collie to the position of Head Coach, and once again we have heard nothing but positive feedback from the majority of our members. The processes Rhett is putting in place now will continue to improve the clubs participation and results across all areas of surf sports.

We also welcomed Zarah Meehl to the team in January and Zarah has also fitted in very well with professional staff and volunteers alike.

I think most members would be in agreement with me when I say that the professionalism with which the club has been run in the past year has been second to none.



The other major benefit of having full time professional staff has been the renewed enthusiasm of a number of our hard working volunteers. The business of running a surf lifesaving club is becoming increasingly cumbersome and time consuming. Having employed staff taking away a lot of the paperwork and day to day transacting has allowed many of our volunteers to devote their energies to some more fruitful areas. The prospect of taking on a Board of Management or other senior role is no longer as daunting as it once was.

I would particularly like to thank Club Captain Kirsten Phillips, Treasurer Deb Hoogvliet and Secretary/Director of Surf Sports Simon Richards for their ongoing efforts over the past 12 months. I would also like to thank Barb Seaward for her endless work as Chief Training Officer - it is one of the most time consuming and difficult positions in the club.

Congratulations to Kirsten, Barb and all of our patrol captains and patrolling members for keeping Kings Beach safe for another season. The standards of our patrols have once again been very high and I think all members should be extremely proud of their efforts.

Cathy Dick also did the club very proud with her efforts and the way she conducted herself over the past year as the club's entrant in the Conrad Jupiters Summer Surf Girl Quest. Cathy was unlucky not to win the event, and in

the process raised more than \$53,000 and won the Award for Innovation. With the success of Cathy's campaign the club has now made a decision that we will endeavour to have an entrant in this competition every year.

The Supporters Club continues to trade very well under the day to day control of Operations Manager Julie Richards and the close knit team she has working with her.

The ongoing success of the Supporters Club is integral to the ongoing implementation of our long term strategic objectives of the surf lifesaving club. We are fortunate to have the ongoing management expertise of the Caloundra RSL to oversee and guide the direction of the Supporters Club into the future.

I am pleased to report to all members that negotiations relating to the future redevelopment of the club house are continuing with both the Caloundra City Council and State Government. There is nothing concrete to report at this point but we are hopeful that the club will have both an increased lease area and renewed lease in the near future.

In closing, please enjoy reading this 72nd Annual Report and the achievements of your fellow club members over the past year, and once again thank you all for your contribution to the ongoing success of the club.

In offering my report to the 72nd Annual Report of Metropolitan Caloundra Surf Life Saving Club I congratulate club members and management on their achievements of the last twelve months. When we are celebrating our 75th year in 2008 we will look back at the 2004-2005 season as a turning point in the club's history and the start of a Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC dynasty in surf lifesaving.

Having worked in surf lifesaving professionally for nearly 15 years at the time of my appointment, I was certain I had experienced all the challenges a staff role could offer. As Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC executive officer I found there are many more when you deal face to face with the volunteers who are the organisation's foundation. As a result not only was I able to offer a little of my experience to guide us, but I also learned a great deal about working in support of our members on a day to day basis.

With a mandate from the Board of Management to drive some change in the way the club is run I was able to charge ahead with new ideas. I did so safe in the knowledge that I was never going to be able to please everyone all the time. In creating a vision for the club and ultimately a Club Management Plan what I did discover is that the only detractors from the process were those who chose not to get involved and don't really have the club's best interests at heart.

For the most part our membership responded to the new style of leadership club management was flexing, and the new open style of communication we embraced to make our members informed, aware and a little more passionate about the club. Importantly, it was this same philosophy that engaged our sponsors, Caloundra City Council and other external stakeholders. They too are starting to share in the success as the club begins to manage and measure itself against planned objectives.

My focus was largely in establishing systems and underlying frameworks for key areas of operation. In the first half of the year there was a great deal of administration support required to keep lifesaving, training and assessment and management on track with the current management plan. Once we successfully recruited Zarah in January I was able to adjust my focus to working "on the business" rather than "in the business". I was able to rewrite sponsorship profiles, look at marketing plans and put together the club's first ever membership survey.

The survey was the catalyst for much of the change that is contained within the 2006 Club Management Plan. We responded to the needs of our members and created some real value for our members who, in particular, will take on key roles. Patrol captains, trainers, assessors and IRB personnel will be pleased to see an investment in recognising and rewarding them for their work.



Our under 14 age group members will be the foundation of the club's youth development program for the first time breaking the shackles of normal "nipper" activities on a Sunday morning. We recognised these young members and their families sought increasing challenges and increasing recognition of their capacity as youth rather than children. As a consequence a full and innovative annual program will be in place to fully prepare these young members for their participation in lifesaving, surf sports and volunteering activities in the future.

The club's members will more and more begin to accept the realm of professional administration and as we trust staff to work on behalf of our volunteers so too will we be able to harness the true power of our volunteers. Focusing on the fun stuff will create opportunities for our volunteers to really get a sense of achievement from reaching planned objectives.

A professional approach to planning, management and operations will yield results into the future. Our key external stakeholders like Caloundra City Council will take notice of our club above all others as we accept the onus is on us to enhance the relationship for our own benefit. In return I implore Caloundra City Council to take note of the position other regional local governments are taking with their local surf clubs. Caloundra City should be talking with Gosford, Wyong and Coffs Harbour Councils to learn more about their infrastructure and

funding support programs specifically for surf lifesaving and how they are achieving significant returns on their investment in tourism and community service areas.

While I regret not being resident at the club over the next few years to experience the benefits of what we have put in place, I will however take great pride in my future membership of the club. The lure of a role with an Olympic sport was too much though no less of a challenge than working with a club like Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC. I wish the Board of Management, volunteer members and my staff a prosperous future and offer my services to continue penning controversial front page articles for the newsletter should you need one.

Administration and planning within the club is not one of the most inspirational roles for a volunteer but it is a very important one and one I have enjoyed for a number of years now. Planning

The endorsement of the 2004-2005 Club Management Plan heralded a new era for Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC. With a blue print for future success we delivered to our members a commitment for the club's management and operations in an easy to follow planning document. While it took us some time to get used to the enhanced method of reporting against planned objectives, the idea of having a Club Management Plan has been cemented in our minds and our processes and it will be a feature of our annual planning process.

Administration

With the employment of our professional staff team, comprising an Executive Officer, Head Coach and Administration Assistant, we have improved the standard of our administration procedures, facilities and systems. These achievements are directly linked to the planned objectives in our Club Management Plan which in real terms means that our electronic and hardcopy filing system, email system and our reporting process follow the Club Management Plan structure. This makes it increasingly easy for volunteers and staff alike to manage club information efficiently and effectively.

2005 Club Member Survey

In February 2005 the club's Management Committee sought the opinion and ideas of the whole club's membership through the implementation of a Club Member Survey. The survey was reasonably lengthy and attempted to get a broad perspective on our member's feelings of satisfaction with our plans and an idea of what are our members' priorities for the short term future. With an excellent response rate we have been able to harness our members' ideas and include them in the 2005-2006 Club Management Plan.

Communication

The redevelopment of the club's website was the catalyst for enhancing all the club's communication tools. We have revamped Kings Beach News as our key print communication vehicle for members. We introduced 'Just Spender Minute' as a feature of our email and



electronic communication in support of our new website. All have proven very popular with members and supporters and will continue to be a feature of the club's administration.

Without the support of some key volunteers our club would not function nearly as well as it does. Our staff needs volunteer support as much as they support us and together we have been able to achieve excellent gains in administration, communication and planning. With the framework we have in place we are confident more volunteers will seek involvement in these activities which provide the foundation for the club's future success.

I thank all our management volunteers for their dedication and support. I thank our professional staff for exceeding the club's expectations. I thank our members for their continuing to invest their personal time in Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC.

The red and yellow flags have been packed away again for the winter months following another hectic but extremely successful season for Met Caloundra's patrolling members.

Patrol services

This season the club fielded 11 patrol teams on a rotating roster which has allowed all members to experience the pleasures, and challenges, of patrolling on different days and at different times. As we endeavoured to accommodate the needs of the majority of our competitors, patrols were inconsistent in frequency. While this proved a challenge for some, the majority of our members have worked extremely hard in making this system work.

To support the patrol roster, a patrol points system was implemented to help the club monitor members' performance throughout the season. After a great deal of consultation with other clubs and our own members, the system was designed so that active rostered patrolling members would have points deducted for missing rostered patrols hours. However, unlike other clubs, we chose to introduce a second aspect to the system which allowed members to 'earn' back points they may have lost. They could do this through completing extra patrol hours or other club obligations. Overall, the points system has been highly successful in monitoring not only the rostered patrol performance of individual members, but also the performance of patrol teams and the club's patrolling performance as a whole. While some minor tweaking may be needed next season, at this stage, this system will remain in place.

Directly contributing to the strength of our patrols this season has been the club's excellent membership recruitment and retention. By the end of this season the club had approximately 120 active bronze members registered. More than 30 of these were new bronzies who pulled on the red and yellow to join our patrol teams during the past 12 months. This season the club has continued to successfully recruit and retain in the under 18 area as has happened with previous years. However, it has been fantastic to see an influx of 18 + members as well.

Our new bronze members have been overwhelmingly enthusiastic with many already moving on to other awards. Well done to the patrol captains and patrol members who have made these recruits feel so welcome.

The strength of the club's membership and patrolling commitment has also been highlighted this season by the exceptional turn out on our non-rostered public holidays - Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day and, inadvertently, ANZAC Day. The turn out on these days was

phenomenal with about 50 members completing voluntary hours. It was great to see a large number of long service and active reserve patrol members pitch in to lend a hand - your experience is always welcome on the beach. Well done.

Our patrols also received a boost with this season being the first for Waverunner 12 operating out of Kings Beach. Having the Waverunner in this area has been beneficial especially with respect to patrolling the Caloundra passage and Happy Valley. While having this service in place put an extra workload on our members, those who put their hand up to join the support services team rose to the challenge and should be proud of their efforts in making it happen.

Rescues and first aid

The rescue and first aid statistics included in this report show just how hectic our patrols were this season. Members completed 91 rescues (including jet ski rescues) and more than 2400 preventative actions (including lost children and shark alarms) throughout the 2004/2005 season. As expected due to school holidays, hot weather and some rough surf days, January was the busiest month with 50 rescues being recorded - 14 of these were recorded on one day alone.

Patrol members also took care of more than 240 first aid cases - 12 of these being recorded as major cases and four spinal injuries. One of the greatest risks on Kings Beach continues to be the rocks at the northern end with a number of our most serious first aid cases requiring an ambulance occurring in this area.

Some of the more notable incidents on Kings Beach that members have been faced with include:

- The rescue of a jet ski and its first-time driver who crashed into the rocks at the northern end of the beach after the driver tried to ride the craft from Brisbane to Gladstone in cyclonic conditions,
- An attempted overdose in the toilets next to the clubhouse with the patient leaving a suicide note in French - she was taken to hospital,
- The sighting of not just one, but two sharks swimming just near the flagged area on a busy day which required the water to be cleared,
- A semi-conscious patient being taken away after playing slip-and-slide on the rocks at the northern end of the beach and landing on his head.

Overall, rescue and first aid figures for this current season were an increase on the previous two seasons. As Caloundra continues to grow as a holiday destination, the club could anticipate that these figures will continue to climb.

In addition to our on-beach services, the skills that our lifesavers learn can, of course, be used in any emergency situation. Congratulations to all of the members who have assisted with emergencies when "off-duty". In particular, congratulations and well done to Shona McClelland who resuscitated a man who had had a massive heart attack in Brisbane City earlier this year. Shona was by herself and received little assistance from the general public when she was giving resuscitation for more than five minutes. The man recovered and met with Shona before she left for England.



Congratulations also to Jess and Liz Dawes who put their skills to good use when they came across an accident involving a car and a child on a bike on ANZAC Day. Well done.

Patrol leadership

The role of patrol captain can be challenging. PCs are the first ones on to the beach and the last ones off. They are responsible for paperwork, lock up, set up, pack up and everything that happens on each and every patrol. They are the glue that holds our patrol teams together. And this season they have played an integral role in raising our patrol standards, building strong patrol teams and achieving many of the club's lifesaving goals. Well done on an exceptional job.

This season the club began improving its recognition and reward program for PCs - while it was only small steps, plans are in place to further expand this program next season to encourage more members to take on these important roles. While our membership base continues to grow, we will not be able to increase the number of patrol teams we put on the beach unless we build-up the club's leadership base.

To build this leadership base, we need to focus on educating and encouraging our new and junior members about these positions and how they might develop their skills to take them on in the future.

Patrol standards

Our major goal for the season in lifesaving was to win the Buhk Wilkes patrol competition award. While we do not yet know if this has been achieved, no matter what the outcome, setting this goal gave us a focus for raising our patrol standards - and our patrols were certainly of a high standard. Many of our PCs and patrol teams embraced the patrol comp challenge and used their patrol downtime as an opportunity to refine and expand their lifesaving skills through activities such as scenario work.

Congratulations also to the members who competed in the Branch patrol competition. Your participation helped us to gain valuable points for Buhk Wilkes.

As well as focusing internally to improve our lifesaving services, the club also played host this year to an interclub workshop funded by the Caloundra City Council. This workshop was an opportunity for the club captains and CTOs from Dicky Beach, Kawana and Bribie to come together and share information and ideas on lifesaving, patrolling and training and assessment. The major outcome of this workshop was that all clubs agreed that more communication, and a more collaborative approach, particularly to training and assessment was needed.

In addition to developing relationships with neighbouring clubs, a sister club relationship was formed with Kirra Surf Life Saving Club on the Gold Coast. This relationship has involved members from each club spending a weekend at the other club to patrol and socialise. This exchange experience gave members the opportunity to see how patrolling (beach and support service) is conducted on other beaches and in another Branch. The highlight of the exchange has been members competing in a Survivor-style fun challenge. Plans are being made to continue this relationship next season.

Gear, equipment and procedures

As identified in the membership survey, gear and equipment care and maintenance needs to be a priority in the coming season. Having people dedicated to ensuring our patrolling gear is of the highest standard helps, however, it will continue to be difficult to keep standards high unless all members take responsibility for looking after it.

While our current patrol trailer has served us well, it has become difficult to maintain and is not fit out for the extra equipment we are now required to have on the beach. Therefore, the club is looking to invest in a new patrol trailer for the coming season which should service our needs better.

As far as patrol procedures go, the most significant change has been to the Sunshine Coast radio system. I know there has been much discussion and some resistance as to how this system would work. However, training has been, and will, continue to be rolled out to all members about this system which should clarify any uncertainties.

Reflecting on the season just past certainly highlights some massive achievements for the club of which all members can be proud. While everyone should take the time during the winter months to have a breather, it is also important for us to put our heads together and start planning for the coming season - there is much to be done before patrols start back on the beach in September.

However, with a clear direction set out in the club's management plan, new and fresh ideas, and enthusiastic members, Met Caloundra is definitely poised for bigger and better things in 2005/2006 in all aspects of lifesaving.

It's been a successful year in Training and Education at Metropolitan Caloundra. This success can be attributed to factors such as a management plan, committed trainers, enthusiastic helpers and water safety volunteers, assessors, and efficient administrators. This is not to say that the year has not been without its difficulties. However, so much was achieved this year because team-work was at play.

PROFICIENCIES

This year, a different system saw proficiencies occur on the same day as the patrol team's third rostered patrol of the season. While this system had its merits, the strain on an already thin team of assessors over a longer period of time means some small adjustments will be made for the upcoming season. Many thanks to Alan Macklin, Tom Holmes and Matt Richards for their commitment to quality and high standards in the club. Proficiencies can prove to be a daunting experience for

those who feel they have forgotten their skills. In the upcoming year, preparation sessions will be held in the weeks leading up to proficiencies to alleviate the pressure some may feel. These preparation sessions are also designed to ease the pressure of assessors who, on the day of proficiency, would prefer to be assessing rather than instructing. Ultimately, proficiency is every member's chance to rebuild their confidence or assist in teaching skills they have previously demonstrated, rather than an inconvenience that should be avoided. Lacking skills in any of our lifesaving activities only weakens the club as a whole.

AWARDS

Bronze Medallion

The Bronze Medallion is merely the beginning of a volunteer surf lifesaver's experience. Making the bronze training experience for the candidates a valuable and enjoyable one paves the way to inspiring continued training and education within surf lifesaving. One primary goal this year was to increase the number of active members for beach patrols. The first step to doing this is to focus on conducting bronze squads, which took priority over other awards. With five squads conducted over the 2004 - 2005 season, and 30 successful candidates, the club fell six short of its goal. This is not to diminish the outstanding commitment of the instructors involved, and the willingness of the candidates to learn their new skills well.



Other Awards

Other awards run in the 2004-2005 season included Surf Rescue Certificates, Advanced Resuscitation Certificate, Senior First Aid, IRB crewman, IRB drivers, Radio Operators Certificate, Defibrillator's Certificate, Resuscitation Certificate, RWC (jetski) operators, Silver Medallion Patrol Captain, and Surf Awareness, Surf Safety and Surf Smart Certificates.

For further statistics regarding these awards, please refer elsewhere in this report.

It can be seen by just looking at this list can see that much has been achieved this season. In many instances we have to look beyond our club to our Branch for their assistance in helping us achieve some of these outcomes.

Training and Education

Probably the biggest challenge for the upcoming season is the further support upskilling of existing trainers to become assessors. We have many within the club who are willing to take that extra step but find the demands of the AQTF and RTO procedures to take a lot of getting accustomed to. The previous season, because of the focus on the 'grass roots' or the Bronze Medallion, a lesser priority was placed on the development of this area: the 2005-2006 season will be the year of the specialty award. It will take a few years for surf lifesaving to get a proper grasp on the implications of its new RTO status, so we as a club cannot expect outcomes overnight either.

An incentive scheme for trainers and assessors may be

implemented in the upcoming year, not only to provide incentive to these volunteers, but to recognise their value and qualifications within the club. Training and education is more or less the shopfront of our organisation. It's what new members experience when they first join, and it's what keeps them involved in the long run. A confident, effective lifesaver is a well trained one.

Furthermore, in order to alleviate the pressure placed on a few to deliver assessment and training, shared training in specialist awards is proposed in the next season. We are on the only club on the Sunshine Coast that is taking a realistic look at what can really be achieved in assessment and training. We can look forward to some of our specialist awards taking place at our neighbouring clubs.

While the success in awarding members with new certificates cannot be refuted, this success has to be attributed to so many who offered their time to achieve this. Thank you to all and sundry for your assistance in delivering new and upskilled members to our club in 2005. Names will not be mentioned for fear of leaving someone out - there were just so many of you. While my first year as Chief Training Officer was extremely challenging, it was also made all the more enjoyable by the fact that so many were willing to offer assistance when they could. Team work is what makes Metropolitan Caloundra the success that it is.

Our goal this year was to improve Met Caloundra's performance in Branch, State and National surf sports competition.

The Surf Sports Committee is pleased to present its report to the members of Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC. For the first time, the Committee and its Officers had a plan for the season and is what this report is based upon. In presenting this report, we acknowledge the input of our new Head Coach Rhett Collie, who has had a major influence on the direction and success of our Club in the Surf Sports environment.

After a season Rhett now have a gauge as to what needs improving and how to go about it. There were many stories of success this year, and we stress that this was on the back of many years of hard work by the athletes, not simply because Rhett's situation changed.



Rhett's role change has allowed him to become a lot more professional in his approach to coaching, which will have flow on effects to the athletes.

Below is a report based on the 2004/2005 Management Plan:

Training

An important aspect to training this year was Rhett's ability to split the squads up and ensure the athletes received the most from each session. Consequently the following squads were developed

S1: Board & Swim (No Ski)

S2: Board, Swim & Ski

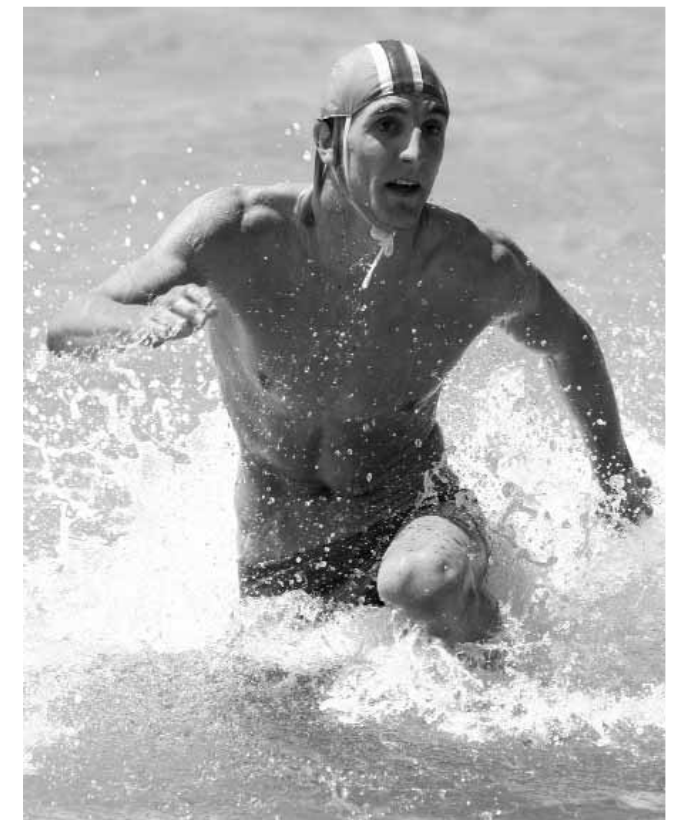
Cr: Board & Ski (No Swim)

Br: Members living in Brisbane; Join in with coast programs as much as possible

N1: Nippers still learning basic concepts

N2: Experienced nippers. Learning basics, but include race practice

It was important that we prioritised the senior squads to ensure the profile of Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC was exposed. All squads below this were designed to be a feeder system for the senior squads.



Coast based members enjoyed the opportunity to attend a maximum of six sessions per week. This culminated in a total of 173(S2) or 137(S1) sessions for the year, not including pool based training (5/6 sessions per week) or carnival weekends (13 weekends for the season). As you can see, it requires a large commitment from our competitive team to be successful.

Brisbane based members obviously had the disadvantage of having to travel up from Brisbane to attend most sessions. A Thursday afternoon session was held in Brisbane at Deep Water Bend for the majority of the year and was reasonably well attended. My thanks must be extended to those who assisted throughout the year, in particular Bill Davis and Terry O'Conner. It was my intention that Brisbane based members could attend Thursday in Brisbane, Friday afternoon on the coast, Saturday morning and afternoon on the coast, and swim train for the rest of the week. For various reasons this didn't work as well as anticipated, and is an issue that will be discussed leading up to next season.

Nippers this season were split into groups based on ability rather than age. Sessions were conducted outside of the normal Sunday morning, based on the premise that Sunday morning nippers was about more than surf sports. This was received with a mixed response, however if we can provide a quality program for Sunday mornings, I'm sure all the misgivings will be put aside. Regular sessions were provided Tuesday mornings, Thursday & Saturday afternoons, all of which were well attended throughout the season.

For next season, session attendance needs to be discussed and improved:

- There are only 14 sessions in a week that Rhett can



- conduct (considering school or work). Members need to commit to making available sessions.
- To be successful in surf sports, competitors need to train in the surf. Organised travel arrangements are needed to ensure Brisbane based members attend coast based sessions.
- More coast based nippers at nipper sessions.

The demands on the team managers continued to increase this season and our appreciation to those that did assist during the year. Our Club always had the required number of officials at carnivals throughout the season and our thanks to them for their continued dedication. At times it was difficult to organise water safety and IRB crews due to our shortage of qualified members, but in the end we managed to do so. Many thanks to those that assisted. We will be endeavouring to train more members to assist with officiating and water safety in future years.

Competition

A quick look at the competition results will indicate the large number of carnivals held this season. Our members competed at approximately 30 separate carnivals from October through to April, which is the equivalent of about 4 per month. The majority of these were in southeast Queensland, but others were also held in Moore Park, Mackay, Coffs Harbour, Portsea and Coogee. Once again, there were quite a few clashes with different carnivals, but members of the Surf Sports Committee were able to attend the majority of them. Met Caloundra SLSC has members compete in most disciplines from, board, ski and beach through to masters, surf board riding and surf boats. A few of these areas were lacking in numbers, which the Committee is looking to address next year as long as it falls within the objectives of the Club.



Metropolitan Caloundra athletes competed with distinction throughout the year. Highlights included two members in the KNG Series and some memorable performances at the senior State and National Titles as well as the nipper State Titles. Although we had some great individual performances, the performance in team events was at times lacking. This is an indication of the depth within the club as well as members not realising the benefits of team racing. Hopefully the success of a few of the individual competitors will inspire our 2nd, 3rd & 4th string competitors to train harder and create a number of winning teams.

Administratively, all the required paperwork for carnivals was completed as needed and members informed prior to each carnival through the website. The committee allocated training and craft subsidies to numerous competitors as per the current policies. The Committee is currently reviewing policies in relation to subsidies to be implemented next season.

Development

Surf sports development was based around training this season. We felt it was important for Rhett to spend the

year observing the members' response to training and competition, while ensuring there basic skills were developed. After the first year, we now think the members are better skilled and understand the basic format of the training sessions.

This year Rhett conducted two training camps for the nippers. The first was open to all and covered most things nippers are exposed to whilst competing. It was held just after the New Year, prior to nippers recommencing after their Christmas break. The second was for the nippers competing at the state titles, and covered topics relevant to a higher level of competition.

It has been a busy 2004/2005 season and the Committee wish to thank all those who attended sessions or assisted throughout the season. It has been a huge team effort to ensure our athletes are at the top of the heap, and there is still plenty of work to be done in making Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC the leader in surf sports.

Our current facility has reached its full capacity and we cannot hope to grow the business any further in the existing building. The need to resolve our ongoing negotiations with Council and State Government to allow redevelopment of the building become even more urgent by the week. After spending a considerable period of time in discussions with both arms of government we hope to have some firm answers with which to begin future planning in the very near future.

Two major milestones were achieved through the licenced club operation in the 2005 Financial Year. The first milestone was the full repayment of the outstanding loan carried over from previous refurbishments, in addition to the final payments on all gaming machine contracts. For the first time in many years the club no longer carries any debt related to the licenced club operation. The second major milestone is the funding of Surf Club operations by the Supporters Club. For the first time in many years the Supporters Club is providing funding to allow the Surf Life Saving Club to deliver additional programs under its Management Plan. The benefits of this funding are there for all to see.

I would like to thank the rest of the Supporters Club Committee for their ongoing support and input during the year. I would also like to say thank you and well done to Operations Manager Julie Richards and the entire staff whose dedication to the club is second to none. Thank you also to Tony Costain, Steve Fromont and the rest of the management at the Caloundra RSL whose expertise continues to provide the necessary guidance that helps produce the excellent results we have seen. Thank you also to Des Dwyer and Ken O'Connell for your continued support and assistance in relation to the Building Redevelopment.

On behalf of the Caloundra RSL Management Services team I am pleased to report on the 2004 / 2005 trading result.

The past 12 months have seen a period of consolidation for your club, trading revenues have been maintained at a very strong level and have resulted in a net cash operating profit of \$330,000. The result of which, I'm pleased to report, now sees the Supporters Club trading debt free with all previous outstanding loans repaid and guarantors released from their commitments.

However, the past 12 months have also highlighted the urgent need for the reconstruction of the clubhouse facilities. Whilst this years profitability was again quite exceptional, the facilities that our team is operating out of and the amount of repairs & maintenance required throughout the year certainly took its toll.

Due to the age of the facilities, the expectation is that the continued band-aid approach can only progress for so long. Future potential for operational growth will be limited, simply due to limitations of space. Those of you who frequent the venue, especially on a weekend, would concur that opportunities for additional growth, especially in the food department, are highly unlikely.

As some of you may already be aware, your Committee has been actively pursuing the fast-tracking of the redevelopment process. Unfortunately, whilst this is still progressing, in all likelihood the anticipated amount of revenue required (in the vicinity of \$4.5 million) is going to be outside the ability of the Surf Club as a stand-alone entity to secure.

It will potentially require a more direct link to the RSL, via bricks & mortar and other initiatives, to ensure that this redevelopment can still proceed in the immediate future.

To Matt Richards, Simon Richards and the other Board

members, on behalf of the Management team I sincerely thank you for your support and input throughout the year.

To the RSL Committee members, who have again volunteered their time to service both organisations, I thank them for their commitment. Via the experience generated by these two organisations it is of no surprise as to why the Club is now enjoying its current success.

To Julie Richards and her team, I again congratulate them on their superb efforts and what they have achieved over the past 12 months. Far bigger and more modern venues would love to be performing at the level that Julie has this operation achieving.

And finally, to you, the Members, I thank you for your ongoing support of the Supporters Club. Whilst I appreciate that not every decision made on a business sense is going to be palatable to the Life-saving organisation, please be assured, every decision made is done so with the best intentions of the Supporters Club's profitability in mind.
