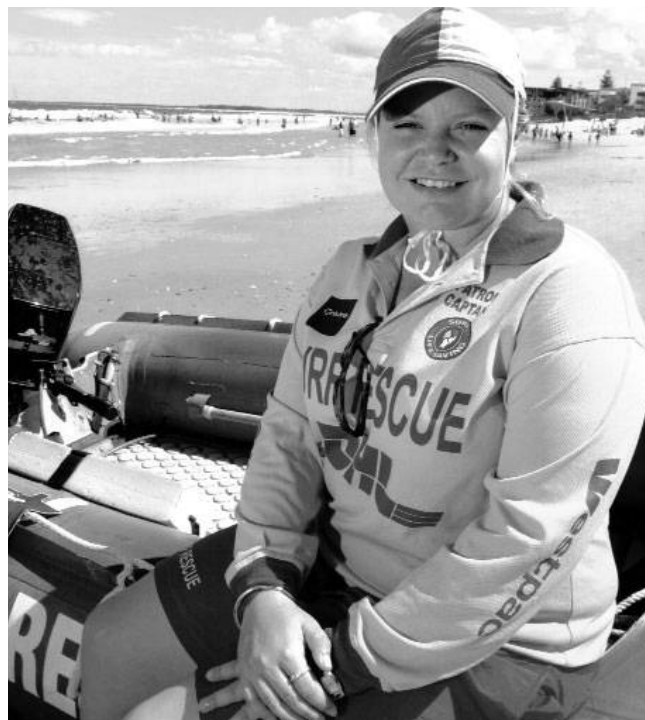

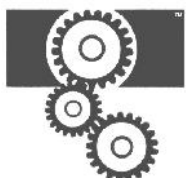

It has been another successful season for our patrols on Kings Beach with no lives lost and significantly fewer rescues performed as compared to the previous season.

Patrol statistics

In total, 71 rescues were performed during the 2005/2006 season. This reduction may have been due to the fact that the surf was kind to us this year with good conditions for much of the season particularly during the busy Christmas period. However, I would like to think the reduction in rescues is due to the vigilance of our patrols in using preventative actions to ensure rescues did not need to be carried out. This season the club recorded 1445 preventative actions.

First aid cases were up considerably from last year with nearly 100 more first aid cases treated as compared to the previous season. With the rocks at the northern end of the beach soon to be transformed into Caloundra's "South Bank", hopefully this will mean the number of first aid incidents in this area will decline.

Probably the most bizarre episode on patrol this season was the days when the surf delivered a mountain of foam to the beach for more than a week. For most members, it was like nothing ever seen before with foam well above head height at high tide and pushing over the fences. The biggest challenge for the patrols was not only keeping people out of the water but out of the foam - people have been known to drown in sea foam. When the foam eventually subsided, the full extent of erosion to the beach due to the high tides and big surf was revealed. While the sand is slowly coming back, it still has a way to go.

Patrol standards

Overall, the standard of, and attendance to, patrols remained high for the majority of the season. All members fit in well with the slightly extended patrolling hours which have helped us to better protect the bathing public at Kings Beach.

While our patrol standards and attendance have remained high, the new patrol inspection format introduced this year has certainly challenged our teams and our office bearers. The new system has taken some getting used to, but hopefully we can still finish strong in the Buhk Wilkes competition. If nothing else, the patrol inspection changes have been an opportunity for us to refine our patrol practices and skills so that we are ready to take on the challenge again next season.

While on the topic of inspections, thanks to those who took part in the patrol competition this year at Branch, State and Aussies. Your efforts contributed valuable points to our club's Buhk Wilkes totals. Congratulations to the club's Under 17 patrol competition team made up of Alec Gold, Sean McCullagh, Corey Evans and Troy Davis who took out a bronze medal at Aussies - our first ever in such an event.

The team which competed in this event were made up of members taking part in a new program at the club - Future Leaders. This program was designed to broaden our younger and newer members' understanding of lifesaving and encourage them into leadership roles in the future. Six members successfully completed this program this season - Jess Dawes, Kelsey Brislane, Rachel Barber, Alec Gold, Sean McCullagh and Troy Davis. I hope the experiences and skills these members have gained through this program have helped them to become better lifesavers and we certainly look forward to you continuing the program in the future and moving into leadership roles down the track.

Patrol leadership

Our patrol teams received a healthy boost of new members this season which was great to see and certainly helped us to have strong numbers on the beach. All of the new members who have come on board this year seem to have settled in well and are more than willing to get involved in many areas of the



club - thanks to our current members for making them feel welcome.

While our membership is growing, the club is still finding it difficult to fill some of the leadership roles such as lifesaving office bearer positions and patrol captains. With an ever-increasing membership, we need members to step up into these roles so that we can continue to expand the number of patrol teams we field which will in turn decrease the patrolling workload for all of our members. I believe there are quite a number of members who are ready to take that next step up and the club will be working closely with them to ensure they have the support and training to do this next season. Hopefully patrol captain incentive scheme introduced this season will help to encourage more members into this important role and help us to hold onto our experienced PCs.

To the patrol captains, new and old, who have stepped up this season and taken on the job, thank you for your efforts. You have ensured our patrols remained at a very high standard and have provided strong leadership to your teams. All of the patrol captains have done an exceptional job both on and off the beach in making Met Caloundra a stronger and better club.

A special thanks to Jim Chisholm and Steve Maitland who took on two patrol teams as the PC and PVC this season - it was a big job and they did it well. Also well done to the PCs who showed their sense of teamwork throughout the season. I know there was a lot of "helping mates out" going on throughout the year which is great to see - we must always keep in mind that we are all in this together.

Training and education

To all of the members of the club who have gained new awards this season well done and congratulations, your new-found skills are certainly a valuable asset on the beach. In total more than 110 new awards were gained by members of our club. Thank you and well done also to the training officers and assessors who have given up so much of their time over and above their core duties to help these members through their awards and proficiencies. I would particularly like to thank Barb Seaward and Liz Dawes for their efforts in keeping the

education side of the club on track and moving forward - you have both done an outstanding job.

Support services

Well done also to the members who have gone over and above in their duties by being part of the Support Services team. Met Caloundra members have contributed considerable hours to both Waverunner 12 and Surfcom this season on top of their normal patrolling duties. Well done in particular to Peter Hoogvliet who has done a tremendous job coordinating Waverunner 12 for the past few seasons. These support services are an extremely important extension of our lifesaving service and give our members invaluable experiences and skills. I would encourage those members who are already involved to continue their excellent work. For those who would like to get involved in support services in the future please let the club know.

This backbone of support and commitment has contributed to the continued success and goal plan for training and assessment

Proficiencies

This year saw the continuation of improvement with the processing of proficiencies, many thanks to Alan Mackin, Tom Holmes, Matt Richards, Bruce Edwards, Sheridan Harper and Simon Richards for their commitment to quality and high standards in the club.

Proficiencies can prove to be a daunting experience for those who feel they have forgotten their skills. In the upcoming year, preparation sessions will be held in the weeks leading up to proficiencies to alleviate the pressure some may feel. These preparation sessions are acknowledged and designed to ease the pressure of assessors whom, on the day of proficiency, would prefer to be assessing rather than instructing.



Awards

Bronze Medallion

Being the stepping stone of a volunteer surf lifesaver experience, courses should be structured to ensure that the training experience for candidates is a valuable and enjoyable time thus ensuring quality and inspiration for our club with energetic and valuable team members.

From here we should encourage all our members to enhance themselves with the unique and wonderful additional awards that are now available to them thus giving them a gateway for encouragement and leading them on to become trainers and assessors being a benefit to our club and giving them a tool within their own lives and workplace.

For the 2005/2006 period the club ran four bronze medallion courses with 37 successful candidates. Congratulations to those new members who took this first step this year.

Other awards

Other awards run over the 2005/2006 season included:

Three Advance Resuscitation courses, two Defibrillator courses, one resuscitation course (camp), one Surf Rescue Certificate course, one IRB Crewman course, one IRB Driver course, one Train Small Groups course, as well as a range of Surf Awareness, Surf Safety, and Surf Smart Certificates.

We can see that much has been achieved this season. We also acknowledge and thank our Branch for their assistance in helping us achieve some of these outcomes.

The coming season

The challenge for the upcoming season is rolling out the new resuscitation changes which become effective 1 August 2006.

We will also be looking to upskill existing trainers to become assessors, encouraging new trainers to gain their Train Small Groups award which has previously been a daunting experience for some due to the paperwork process. This has been acknowledged now



and Branch is working on making this a more fluid and easier process with less paperwork - details to be forthcoming.

The training officer and assessor incentive scheme has worked well and will be continued with making a few improvements.

This should be looked at in order that no one person has too much of a workload, a more happy team of trainers and assessors will encourage and ensure the continuance of good training and assessment within Metropolitan Caloundra.

The success in awarding members with new certificates cannot be refuted. This success has to be attributed to so many who offered their time to achieve this. To all those team members a huge thank you. There are too many of you to name, the benefit of your efforts has made Metropolitan Caloundra a most rewarding club for its quality in training and commitment.

It gives me great pleasure to submit the report covering surf sports at Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC for the 2005-2006 season. Once again, our Club has excelled at most disciplines, in the majority of age groups and dozens of carnivals throughout Australia.

Training

Rhett Collie has had another extremely busy season with the Club in his position as head coach of our craft and water competitors. Squad numbers have increased substantially since Rhett started in July 2004 and he has had to tinker with his program to accommodate these extra members. He has also been ably assisted by assistant coaches Jeff Morris and Bill Davis.

In other areas, we had three boat sweeps (Mick Bacon, Len Fox and Jase Bean) coaching our two surf boat crews. Next season, all surf boat sweeps will be required to obtain their Level 1 Coaching qualification. James Creedy also obtained his IRB Coaching qualification, which was a requirement for the Club to compete in IRB competition. David and Chris Stewart also held regular training sessions in Redcliffe for our beach competitors.



Competition

Every year, the season seems to get longer and busier and the 2005-2006 season was no different. Since last year's report, our IRB team competed in the Queensland IRB series and the State Championships. In August, they also competed at the Australian IRB Championships, which was reinstated by SLSC, with one crew making the final of the Open Male Rescue Tube Race.

Our junior members started the season with the Rainbow Beach carnival in October and ended it with the Queensland Junior State Championships in April. The Club achieved some great results at the State Titles, placing 10th overall on 63 points, including eight medals.

There was some renewed enthusiasm from our surf boat fraternity this year, with the Club having two Reserve Grade crews swept by Len Fox and Michael Bacon. Michael Bacon's crew showed some outstanding form throughout the entire season in the Red Rooster series and were unlucky not to progress further than their semi-final positions at the State and Australian Championships.

Our beach competitor numbers have grown considerably this season, led outstandingly by Chris Stewart. The beach competitor numbers increased considerably this season, and hopefully they can continue to grow into the future. Chris won the open beach sprint and beach flags at the State Championships, placed second in the beach sprint at the Australian Championships and placed second in the beach sprint and third in the beach flags at the World Championships in Lorne Victoria.





The Club also had a small but committed group of members competing in surf board riding throughout the season, under the guidance of Karen Bray. They were competitive all season, but luck did not go their way at the Australian Championships in the small and challenging surf.

Our board, ski, iron and swim competitors continued to grow as a group and this was reflected in the outstanding results achieved throughout the season. The most pleasing aspect was the participation and achievement in all age groups from under 15 to open. Our Club has some very talented individuals that are achieving great success and this is also starting to rub off on our other competitors. A special mention to Corey Jones and Chris Stewart for winning the Club's first individual open medals at the Australian Championships for a number of years. Chris placed second in the Open Male Beach Sprint and Corey placed second in the Open Ironman, results that they can both be justifiably proud of.

Unfortunately, a number of our masters competitors sustained injuries throughout the season and as such we had very few members participating at carnivals. It is good to see that there are already a number of members keen to build our masters numbers for next season.

Record numbers of our members were also involved in representative teams this season. The club had seven members in the Queensland Representative Team that successfully won the Interstate Championships. Northcliffe was the only Club with more representatives. Jessica McDonnell was also made Captain of the Junior State Team, while Rhett Collie was Assistant Junior Coach and Simon Richards as Senior Team Manager. Mick Bacon's surf boat crew also represented the Sunshine Coast Branch at the Interbranch Surf Boat carnival. Corey Jones and Chris Stewart have also been accepted into the SLSA High Performance Squad for 2006-2007, which will hopefully put them in a position to be selected in an Australian representative team in the near future.

In the Kellogg's Nutri Grain Ironman series, the Club this year had four representatives. Gemma Newbiggin was an automatic qualifier from last season, while Corey Jones, Dylan Newbiggin and Chloe Jones qualified

through the trials for a spot in the top 20. Gemma and Corey qualified through to the top 10, and placed 5th and 8th overall.

For the first time, the Club was also represented in the Interclub Championships at the World Lifesaving Championships, which were held in Geelong and Lorne in February 2006. This was a completely different concept to normal carnivals as a team had to be selected and only one or two members were able to compete in each event. For our first attempt, the Club achieved some outstanding individual results in the surf life saving section. We also competed in a number of events in the pool lifesaving section, without success. The next World Titles are being held in Germany in 2008.

Administration

The administration requirements behind surf sports continues to increase every season. It is no longer just a matter of nominating members and then turning up - we also need to nominate officials, water safety, IRB crews, sign declarations, ensure patrol hours are up to date and notify our members of details.

Many thanks to all the officials, water safety and assistant team managers for their continued support at carnivals throughout the season. A special thanks to those members that attended the IRB Can Laying & Water Safety course as a requirement to provide IRB water safety at carnivals. Unfortunately, the higher authorities failed miserably in implementing this system, but hopefully this will improve in the coming season.





This season, the Surf Sports Committee made some major changes to the craft and training sponsorship criteria. There will probably be some minor amendments for next season, but the main emphasis will remain. During the off season, the Committee will also be sitting down to address some issues in relation to team selection.

Conclusion

It is hard to believe that back in 1997-1998, our Club only won 2 bronze medals at the Open State Championships and finished 26th overall. Eight years later, in 2005-2006, we collected 14 medals (including 7 gold) and finished 8th overall.

We also won 10 medals at the Australian Championships and finished a very impressive 14th overall. We were the 3rd highest placed Club within the Sunshine Coast Branch, behind Maroochydore and Alexandra Headland and ahead of Clubs such as Mooloolaba and Kawana Waters.

It is a credit to everyone within the Club for this outstanding improvement over the past 8 years. It is great to know that these results have been achieved without the need to 'approach' members from other Clubs to bolster our own ranks. The majority of our competitors are all 'home-grown' and the few that have come from other Clubs have come on their own accord. I now believe we have a product at Metropolitan Caloundra that is attractive to competitors.

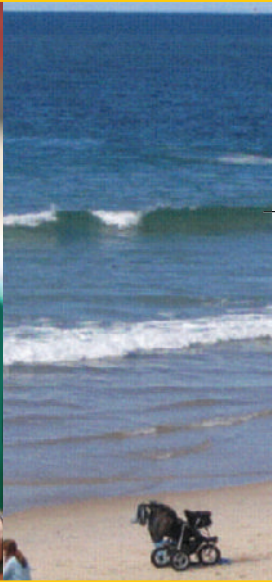
After three and a half years as Director of Surf Sports, I have decided to stand down, but will still be nominating

It is my pleasure to once again report on the activities of the Supporters Club for the 2005/06 trading year. Your Club continues to trade well, especially given the intense competition in the immediate area. The hard work of all those involved in the operation is reflected in the trading results for the year.

The Supporters Club has recorded an operating profit (before depreciation, donations and management fees) of over \$280,000 which under the circumstances is an excellent result. As I have already alluded to, the number of new venues and the quality of existing entertainment venues in the immediate vicinity has impacted on the Club's profit result, which is slightly down on last year.

The fact that the operations staff responsible for the day-to-day running of the Club have been able to deliver such outstanding results month after month is a tribute to their initiative and determination, given that the best selling point we have is the excellent customer service we consistently provide our members and guests in an ageing building. The on-going maintenance issues relating to operating under these conditions will continue, until we are in a position to upgrade the building.

From my observations of the current Management Committee, ably led by Matt Richards, there is still a fierce determination to proceed with the redevelopment of the clubhouse for the mutual benefit of both the Supporters Club and the Surf Life Saving Club. However, the situation is far more complex than originally anticipated, as we were under the impression all parties involved in the Club gaining a larger land area under a new lease arrangement were in favour of a new clubhouse extending further than the footprint of the existing clubhouse. Recent events would indicate this may not be the case.

The favoured option would now appear to be the construction of a new building within the existing boundaries of the current leased area, with the

possibility of a three-storey design. I share the frustrations of the Committee, staff and members of both clubs as to how long this process is taking and I would urge you all to seek the continued support of the Council through our local Councillor as we look at the various options available.

On behalf of the Management team I wish to acknowledge the support of the Management Committee and thank them for their input throughout the year. It is my experience that they are prepared to listen to all reasonable requests we have made of them over the past year, including expenditure on items that the Club needs to remain competitive with other venues. We have recently upgraded cooking equipment, air-conditioning and the large screen TV's and we will continue to update the areas to allow us to continue the levels of customer service we have become so well known for.

On that note, I would also like to specifically thank Julie Richards and the rest of her team who have continued to excel under trying conditions. Anyone who frequents the Club will know what I mean when I use the term "the friendly club" to describe the atmosphere the staff have created. It is the small, personal differences that have allowed us to gain such a well deserved reputation.

The un-wavering support of the Caloundra RSL Services Club was evidenced again this year with the RSL donating the Management Fee directly to the Surf Life Saving Club. Surely there can be no greater sign of the commitment of the Management Committee of the RSL to the Supporters Club than to allow their Management Services team to operate the club effectively for free. The amount of these donations from the RSL over the past four years now totals \$400,000 and will be pivotal to the success of any clubhouse redevelopment.

To the Members, thank you again for your ongoing support of the Supporters Club. It is your club's success that has allowed the continuation of donations to the Surf Life Saving Club which in turn assists them to keep our beach safe and continue to achieve outstanding results when competing.

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Queensland Associations Incorporation Act 1981. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Queensland Associations Incorporation Act 1981 and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AAS 5: Materiality

AAS 8: Events Occurring after Balance Date

AAS 17: Accounting For Leases

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Income Tax

Net income of the Association is taxable to the extent that non-member receipts exceed non-member expenses. Any net income arising from receipts from members is not taxable.

(b) Property, Plant & Equipment

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

(c) Inventories

Inventories are measured at cost. Costs are assigned on a first-in, first-out basis.

(d) Leases

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not legal ownership, are transferred to the Association, are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised recording the asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments including any guaranteed residual values. Leased assets are amortised over their estimated useful lives. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the leases interest expense for the period.

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.



NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Queensland Associations Incorporations Act 1981. The Committee as determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Queensland Associations Incorporations Act 1981, and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AAS5: Materiality

AAS8: Events Occurring After Reporting Date

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Boards have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous report period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report:

a) Income Tax

The club exempt from Income Tax in accordance with Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

b) Property, Plant and Equipment

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

c) Inventories

Inventories are measured at cost. Costs are assigned on a first-in, first-out basis.

d) Leases

Leases of fixed assets, whether finance leases or operating leases, are expensed in the periods in which they are incurred.

e) Goods and Services tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.

f) Prepayments

This year prepayments have been brought to account to the extent of wages paid and annual dinner deposit. Insurances have not been determined on a prepayment basis, but rather have been expensed in the year of payment.
