In offering my report for the 74th Annual Report of Metropolitan Caloundra Surf Life Saving Club, I would first of all like to thank all members, supporters and sponsors for their wonderful contributions over the past twelve months.

This year has been another successful year with no deaths, or significant tragedies on our beach, Kings Beach or our surrounds Happy Valley and Shelly Beach. This is largely due to the vigilance of our patrolling members. All patrolling members should feel justifiably proud of their efforts under the leadership of our remarkable champion of lifesaving, club captain Kirsten Phillips. Well done!

Last year I mentioned how extraordinarily challenging it would be with the expected growth in Caloundra's population and increased tourism. This year we have already seen some tremendous growth in our

membership, nearly 25%, particularly with our junior activities program. This growth is an indication of Caloundra's changing demography with more families, particularly those with young children choosing our magnificent City as their home. The challenge continues to be able to meet the demands of Caloundra's growth while maintaining our identity.

This application will be supported by a commissioned report demonstrating the social and economical benefits the Metropolitan Caloundra Surf





Life Saving Club and our supporters club provides for Caloundra City and visitors. I look forward to keeping all members informed of our progress.

This year has seen increased enthusiasm across all sections of the club which augers well for the directions emanating from our planning day, being:

- To deliver the highest quality lifesaving service we can to the community,
- To provide a club atmosphere where a member validly feels and knows that they are wanted, encouraged and belong,
- To provide activities and experiences that are fun!
- To foster friendship and mateship,
- To encourage members to develop their skills and themselves.

The ever-increasing tourist and residential population in Caloundra has seen visitations to Kings Beach steadily grow which has resulted in the busiest season yet for our patrols.

While crowds were large, the weather was kind to us this season which resulted in the number of rescues being lower than in previous years. However, of the rescues undertaken, a large number were performed in the Happy Valley and Caloundra bar areas. These areas will be a priority focus for the future expansion of lifesaving services for our club particularly as the area develops and overcrowding on Kings Beach continues.

The area in front of the Rolling Surf also continues to be dangerous with the rocks heavily exposed at low tide and a number of large fixed rips. This area also produced a number of rescues this season including the mass rescue of five teenagers early in 2007.

Well done to all members who have been involved in rescues and other incidents throughout the season, you have performed exceptionally well and should be extremely proud of your life saving efforts.

The new pool area has also increased the workload on our patrols during the season with members being called on to attend numerous, some quite serious, incidents. Hopefully this problem area will be addressed in the near future with the implementation of a lifeguard service.

Patrol attendance was good throughout the year which is reflected in the high number of members achieving both 50 and 100 hours on patrol. Thank you to everyone who contributed to patrols throughout the season, I know it is a big ask to commit so many hours to a volunteer organisation but your efforts are very much appreciated by the club and the local community – we are making a difference. Thanks also to those roving and long service members who helped out on patrols throughout the season - it is wonderful to have your experience and support on the beach.

Speaking of experience, thanks to all of the patrol captains who have done an outstanding job. Your commitment to maintaining high standards and building strong teams has been exceptional. Thank you for your support and vigilance – you are the backbone of our patrols.

Well done to our champion lifesaver and patrol competition competitors, through your participation you have contributed valuable points to our Buhk Wilkes efforts. Congratulations in particular to the Under 15 patrol comp team of Sam Llewelyn, Kelly-Ann Perkins, Skye Fifield and Monique Fifield who took out a bronze medal at the State titles.

Our youth development program, and in particular the Youth Involvement Program (YIPs), has seen our younger members get involved in a range of activities both on and off the beach. Well done to all of those who have completed various levels of this program. Next season we will be looking to further expand our youth program and provide more opportunities for our young members to have fun and get involved in a broader range of activities.

It gives me great pleasure to present the Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC surf sports report for 2006-2007 season. Our club should be very proud of not only the success of the surf sports team but the manner and sportsmanship which they displayed in dozens of carnivals all throughout Australia.

Once again the season was very busy with the club represented in most disciplines and age groups with so many exceptional performances I will struggle to do all justice. Before I try I would like to thank our Head Coach Rhett Collie for his continued efforts and guidance of our surf sports team. His training and development programs along with the people that assist him with these sessions will continue to create a culture that bodes well for the future of our surf sports team.

In the IRB section the team continued to grow this season. With plenty of enthusiasm they competed in the Queensland IRB Series and State Championships. They also ventured to South West Rock for the Australian Championships. Their continued improvement throughout the year should be commended and we look forward to seeing how they go next year.

The club also had a small but committed group of beach competitors this year. The highlight of which was Kelly-Ann Perkins winning the U15 Female 2km Beach run and her brother Kieren doing the same in the U15 Male 2km Beach run at the Australian Championship with Carl Perkins also securing a Bronze medal in the same event. It was also pleasing to see Leonie Huckle make both the U19 Female Beach Sprint and Flags final at the State Championships coming 3rd in the Beach Sprint.

This will be my last report as President of the Metropolitan Caloundra Surf Life Saving Supporters Club. I will nominate to continue my involvement on the committee as a member only next season.

Given this is my last report I would firstly like to thank the committee members, Merv Horne, Bryan Costigan, Deb Hoogvliet, Peter Campbell, Simon Richards and Graham Andrews for their continued support and friendship. Thanks must also be provided to the Caloundra RSL, in particular Tony Costain, Steve Fromont and Julie Richards, your expertise and enthusiasm have taken our small club into a professionally run operation.

We must remember it was only five short years ago that our club was in a very difficult place financially. Within this short period of time the Caloundra RSL has turned our small club into a profitable business. I can assure you that if our surf club was a business for sale you would want to buy it!

This year our operating surplus was down slightly from other years due mainly to the age of the building,

new State laws and industry wide trends of reduced margins. Having said this, our operating profit was over \$180,000 and we are now debt free!

The biggest frustration has been the re development, it has taken us time to settle on a preferred strategy to tackle the redevelopment phase. I now expect that by mid June 2007 we will have formally applied to Caloundra City Council for an extended land lease with a view to redeveloping the club.

The Committee is currently renegotiating the Management Agreement with the Caloundra RSL after the last agreement was made redundant due to unfavourable changes to the Gaming Act. Despite our protests to QOGR, we were unable to obtain an exemption.

I look forward to the upcoming challenges we face with continued growth in membership, redeveloping our club and staking our claim as the premier surf club in Australia.

Trading continues to be difficult with contributing factors of both changes to government legislation and a very tired clubhouse facility which is quiet honestly well past its use by date.

This time last year after much negotiations with Council and other associated parties, I believed we were very close to achieving the long awaited approvals on available leasehold land but behold here we are again, twelve months on and still no decision.

On a positive note we have, all be it very slowly, progressed from where we were this time last year. Thanks must be given to Dennis Rowley, Executive Officer for Met Caloundra SLSC for his tireless dedication to the process of trying to get this project to a guaranteed commencement.

Your Committee now have with lease land, finally resolved and implemented a defined business review to determine now in today's climate what type of facility we can facilitate. Therefore all going well, we should have some final understandings of where we are headed in the very near future.

In relation to this year's trading, it at best can be described as a struggle. The implementation of Government legislation on smoking has greatly affected the entire industry. Through wisdom only known to our illustrious State Government, at a time when Clubs and industry needed stability and unity, our so called Government leaders sore fit to demand and invoke an Office of Gaming policy directive that resulted in the removal of all RSL Committee representatives from the Supporters Club Board.

Why you might ask - when in an age of getting people prepared to donate their time and energy freely is becoming harder, the government in their wisdom, obviously believes volunteers are to be a dime a dozen

by basically inferring that these representatives were incapable of being professional enough to offer their services to two local community based Clubs, due to what they believe could be a conflict of interests. This is something nobody with logic would comprehend.

On a more positive note, Julie Richards and her team have done a fabulous job in what they have achieved during the year, especially in the catering environment with continued growth in sales. Unfortunately the positive outcomes in this area can't compensate for the industry down turn in gaming of state wide up to 20% in some parts ,which has in affect reduced operating cash profits prior to life saving donations and depreciations to \$186,980 for the year.

To the committees both Lifesaving and Supporters, on behalf of the Supporters Club and the Management team we again thank you for your support and to the RSL Committee who again this year donated in full 100% of its management fee back to Lifesaving. Finally, to you the members, we thank you for your continued support of your Supporters Club it is very much appreciated. Remember every bit of support you continue to provide to the Supporters Club allows the Supporters Club to continue to be there to support surf lifesaving.

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Queensland Associations Incorporation Act 1981. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Queensland Associations Incorporation Act 1981 and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AASB 1031: Materiality
AASB 110: Events after the Balance Sheet date
AASB 117: Leases

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Income Tax

Net income of the Association is taxable to the extent that non-member receipts exceed non-member expenses. Any net income arising from receipts from members is not taxable.

(b) Property, Plant & Equipment

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

(c) Inventories

Inventories are measured at cost. Costs are assigned on a first-in, first-out basis.

(d) Leases

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not legal ownership, are transferred to the Association, are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised recording the asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Leased assets are amortised over their estimated useful lives. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the leases interest expense for the period.

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

(e) Prepayments

The amount of \$2,500 relating to an outstanding insurance claim has been recorded in prepayments


Qualification

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Queensland Associations Incorporations Act 1981. The Committee as determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Queensland Associations Incorporations Act 1981, and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AASB: Materiality
AASB: Events Occurring After Reporting Date

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Boards have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous report period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report:

a) Income Tax

The club is exempt from Income Tax in accordance with Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

b) Property, Plant and Equipment

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

c) Inventories

Inventories are measured at cost. Costs are assigned on a first-in, first-out basis.

d) Leases

Leases of fixed assets, whether finance leases or operating leases, are expensed in the periods in which they are incurred.

e) Goods and Services tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.

f) Prepayments

This year prepayments have been brought to account to the extent of a deposit for a new IRB. Insurances have not been determined on a prepayment basis, but rather have been expensed in the year of payment.
