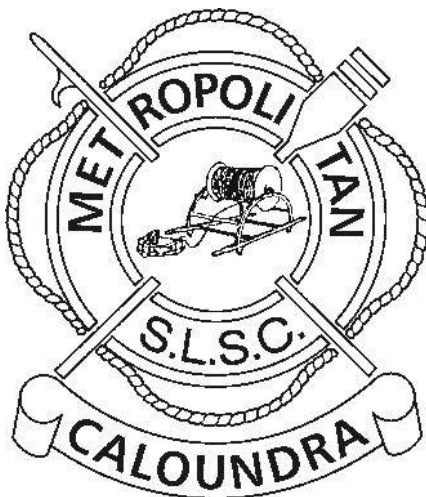

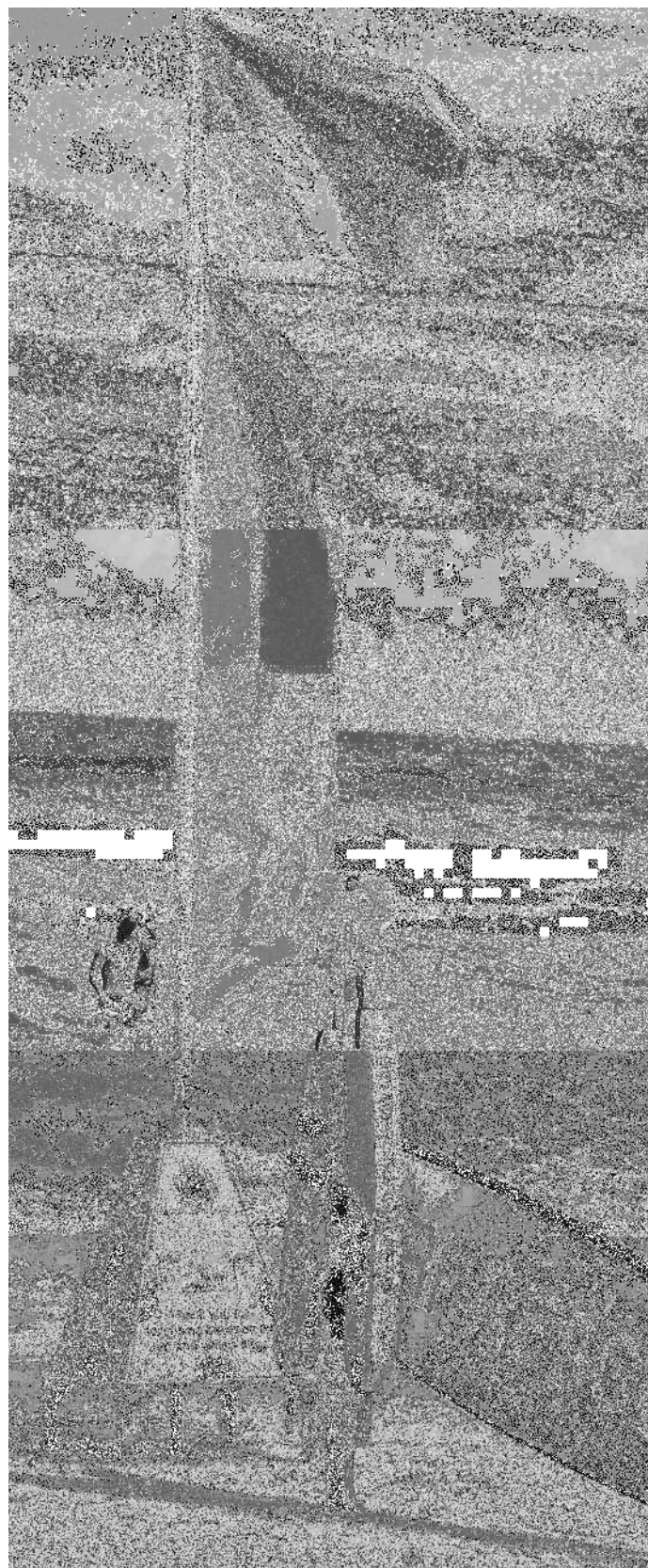

It was most pleasing to attend the SLSQ Awards Night in May 2008, where our Club was awarded the 2007/2008 Youth Development Club of the Year and Carl Perkins Jnr was awarded SLSQ Junior Lifesaver of the Year. Congratulations to our Director of Youth development, Anna Salkeld and Kirsten Phillips for their efforts within this area.

But to be honest, it is these types of things that continue to make our Club and members strong and vibrant and the best on the coast. This season has been by far the most challenging our patrolling members have faced in the past 10 years. Sustained poor weather conditions throughout the season combined with high visitations resulted in our patrols **completing 191 rescues** - the most undertaken in one season in the past 10 years and nearly four times the number completed last season.

Our members definitely stepped up to the challenge and we can be proud of the fact that no one drowned on Kings Beach while our members were on patrol.

However, it was unfortunate that there was a tragic drowning on the Caloundra bar this season. On Boxing Day, our members were called to assist with the rescue of a windsurfer in serious trouble in the middle of the bar. Members Wayne Walker and Steve Dick in the IRB undertook an extraordinary and courageous rescue in appalling conditions to retrieve the patient. They were joined by Rob Schwartz, Liz Dawes, Kyle Parker and members of the Bulcock Beach club on shore to assist with resuscitation. Unfortunately, despite all attempts the patient could not be revived. While this is not the result everyone hoped for, the professionalism, bravery and skill shown by our members must be commended. Our deepest sympathies to the family and a sincere thank you for the kind donations made to the club following the rescue.

Our members also attended a resuscitation case in the club's Supporters Club this year. Darryl Webster and Sharon Brown should be commended for their efforts in this incident which occurred during the start of season bronze camp.

In addition to these incidents, members also undertook a number of mass rescues including two significant incidents at the southern end of the beach and one during a boat roll over on the Caloundra bar. Well done to the members who assisted with these incidents.

The club also had a high profile rescue this year with John Cleary - one of the lead acts for the Caloundra music festival - being rescued and treated by our members. Congratulations and well done to Sam Doonan, Liz Dawes, Steve Dick and Rob Schwartz for their efforts in this event. The club gained extremely positive coverage out of this incident.

Our patrolling members were also recognised with good publicity through the surf safe appeal coverage,

Grant Hackett's visit to the beach, the council promotional DVD, and last but certainly not least, surf patrol filming on Kings Beach for two full days. Make sure you stay tuned to this season of surf patrol - here's hoping our members make it on and don't end up on the cutting room floor.

While rescues were up this season, first aid cases and preventative actions were down on previous years. However, due to the rough surf conditions members had to treat a number of suspected spinal cases.

Overall, all members who undertook rescues and first aid cases this year should be commended - you have done an exceptional job of keeping Kings Beach safe.

Patrol attendance has been strong throughout the season with only a few minor issues with low numbers on patrol (mainly around State and Aussie titles.) Thank you to all those who pitched in with voluntary hours during the season particularly on Christmas day, Boxing day and New Year's day.

The club seemed to fair well in **Buhk Wilkes inspections** again this season, while we had a bit of a shaky start, patrol teams rallied well and ended up pulling consistently high scores including one inspection where no points were lost. Fingers crossed we finish well when the Branch results are announced in July.

On the **gear and equipment** front, the club received a number of new items through grants including two patrol stand one from the SLSQ Foundation and one from the DES grant, three radios and an Advanced Resuscitation bag from the SLSQ Foundation, and a laptop for training and a new manikin also from the Department of Emergency Services. Thanks to Branch for securing items for the club including sunscreen, eskies and five new bum bags. Thanks also to Zillmere Football Club for their donation of a spinal board. Keeping our patrol gear and equipment up to scratch is always a challenge. This season I think the standard of equipment has been extremely high throughout the year and a huge thank you must go to members including Barry Thomas, Rob Schwartz, Gary Brockenshire and Gary Jones (for looking after our biggest piece of equipment - our clubhouse) for looking after our gear.

It was fantastic to have a new trailer on the beach this season that has been designed to fit all of our beach gear (although some patrols still haven't quite worked out the art of getting it on and off the beach). A huge thank you to Jade Engineering for their kind donation and for getting this trailer on the beach. Thanks also to the members who helped in kitting it out.

To our supporters, Eagle Boys and Tanja's, thank you for your support with providing food for our patrols - well fed patrol members seem to make for happy patrol members and your contribution is certainly a morale booster especially on the bad weather days.



This season, the club **welcomed 25 new bronzies and 14 SRC members** into the ranks. Our patrolling members also continued to up-skill this season with a focus on IRBs, advanced resuscitation and first aid. Thanks to Darryl Webster, Liz Dawes and the club's team of trainers and assessors for their extraordinary efforts in handling the club's awards and proficiencies.

The club was again well represented in **patrol competition** this season. It was great to see so many younger members getting involved with the club fielding two under 15 patrol competition teams and a number of junior competitors in champion lifesaver at the Branch Championships this year.

Our club again contributed a strong contingent to the **operational support services** team with members rostered on to Waverunner, Surfcom and jet boat. In recognition of these members' efforts, a change has been made to club awards this year which means that any member who has completed 25 hours on patrol on Kings Beach and then additional hours to tallying to more than 100 hours will be recognised by the club. Water safety hours will also be recognised in the same way.

Congratulations to our **patrol captains**, our club is so lucky to have such a great group of patrol leaders who have a massive depth of experience and skill. You have made my job as club captain so much easier and definitely more enjoyable through your support, enthusiasm, dedication and friendships. I thank each and every one of you for your efforts in making our patrols so strong and giving such inspiring leadership to our patrol members. Thanks also to all of the members of the lifesaving committee and the Board of Management for your support, in particular to Paula Ryan for her assistance throughout the season. Thanks also to my mum, Chris Phillips for her contribution and support.

I would also like to recognise the efforts of the club's staff - thank you for your support. Thanks also to Branch and State volunteers and staff for your support of Met Caloundra throughout the season.

I would like to make mention of the club's success in the SLSQ awards this year as I think these awards highlight the work of people throughout the club including our patrol captains and patrol mentors. The **Youth Development Club of the Year** award recognises the outstanding efforts our club has made in recruiting, retaining and developing members from the age of 7 up to 25 years. It must be recognised that strong youth membership does not happen overnight. For our club, it is something that has been built up over a number of years and has involved changing the very culture of the club. Our strong membership in the youth ranks has been the result of the youth-focused programs and initiatives which have been implemented and continually improved, not only during this current season, but over the past number of years. To this end, everyone who has been involved in developing and delivering these programs in the club during the past few years must be commended. This is an award that recognises everyone in the club who has helped with all youth activities and initiatives including nippers, youth development events, junior surf sports training, and fundraising. Well done to everyone who has helped in these areas.

My congratulations also to **Carl Perkins** who took out the **Queensland Junior Lifesaver of the Year** award this season. This award recognises a member between 15-18 years of age for their contribution to their club and the lifesaving movement. Carl has put an extraordinary amount of work into the club during the past few years and this recognition is well deserved. Training & Assessment

It is my pleasure to present the Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC training and assessment report for season 2007/08. For those not aware of it, all training and assessment now falls under the auspices of the Australian Lifesaving Academy Queensland and our club is registered as a training venue within the ALAQ. The ALAQ has, over the past 12 months, been reviewing, revising and in some cases completely rewriting the training packages for surf lifesaving awards to bring them in line with nationally recognised standards. This has seen an increase in the resources available to trainers but has also meant they have had to become conversant with the new material. I wish to thank all our trainers and assessors for their patience and diligence while we have been implementing the new award structures

Proficiencies

The start of the season saw the introduction of the new proficiency guide which sets out scenario-based assessment plans for our annual proficiencies. It wasn't the smoothest of transitions from our previous proficiency assessment methods and took a bit of time to get it to run in a timely manner. I would like to thank all of our members for their patience during the introduction of these new procedures.

A big thanks to all our trainers and assessor for their efforts in ensuring our members are achieving the standard required to provide a quality service to members of the public visiting Kings Beach. A special thanks to Liz Dawes for her efforts in ensuring that we had the assessors and assessment tools required at each proficiency day and for her efforts in fine tuning the proficiency process to make it as painless as possible.

Awards

Bronze Medallion

It is always a pleasure to see young, and not so young, people taking the first step in surf lifesaving by qualifying for their Bronze Medallion. The Bronze Medallion is the most difficult award to achieve in surf lifesaving but opens the door to further awards. I would like to thank those of our new bronzies who have already gone on to complete other specialty awards.

For the 2007/08 season the club trained 25 successful candidates for their bronze medallion.

Congratulations to these new members of Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC for their efforts.

Other Awards

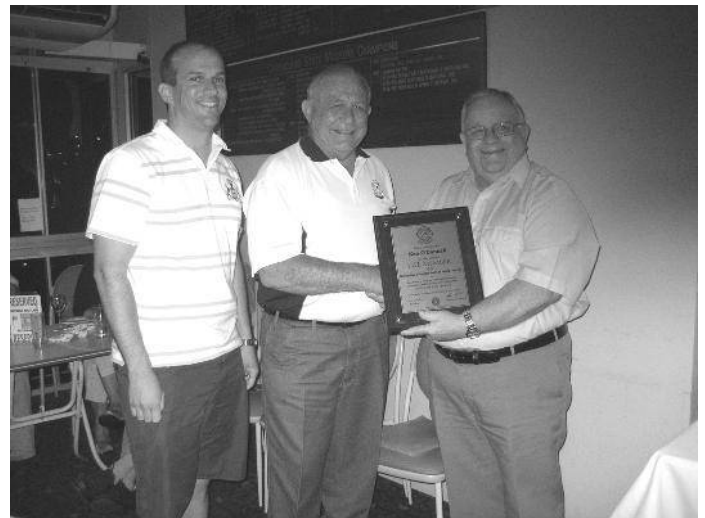
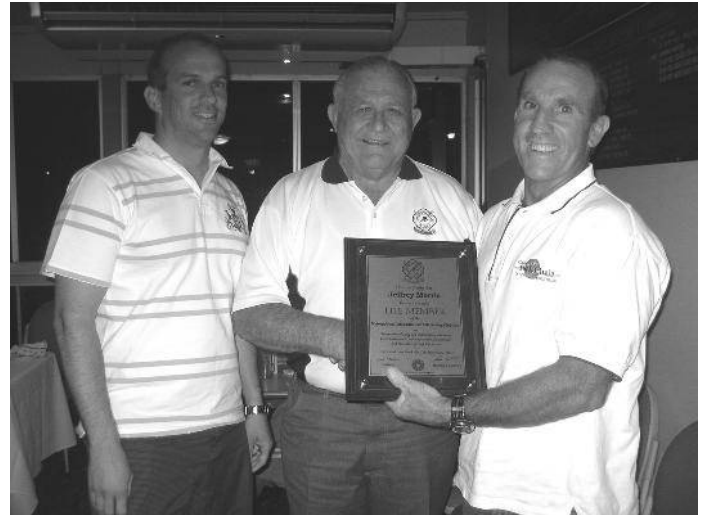
Next year a book, comprehensively documenting seventy-five years of surf lifesaving patrols on Kings Beach, will also be available for purchase.

It has been another successful year for the Metropolitan Caloundra Surf Sports team. We have excelled in most disciplines and received unprecedented coverage for our wonderful club and valued sponsors in all forms of media. Most importantly, we have continued to display sportsmanship which the team, its supporters and club as a whole should be proud.

It was an extremely busy surf sports calendar again this year which was kicked off by our growing IRB team during the colder months which saw them travel to Point Lookout for the State Championships, collecting 4 medals and then South West Rocks for the Australian Championships, where they made two finals with a 4th in the Open Male Rescue being the highlight. It was encouraging to see our Women and Masters competitors in the IRB section flying the flag with good results all year also. For the rest of the competitors, the conditions were very testing particularly after Christmas and provided an opportunity to display our surf skills and compete against the elements particularly at the State Championship held at Kurrawa. This was not the case however, when for the second consecutive year we traveled to Scarborough, Perth for the Australian Championships, where the conditions were flat and the competition fierce.

The club has a committed group of members competing in the surf board riding and over the last few years they have had some great results. This season Elliot Smith led the way at States coming 3rd in the U17 division. It was fantastic to see a few of the crew also travel to Scarborough for Aussies where conditions were far from favourable and saw them and their supporters travel a few hundred kilometres so the competition could be held. Trent Bray, a consistent high performer, came 3rd in the U17 division. Well done.

It was great to see some renewed enthusiasm from Masters competitors this year both in increased numbers and results and we look forward to seeing this continue next year. Steve Maitland, a mainstay of our Masters team, came 3rd in both the 55-59 years Single Ski and Ironman at States. The Masters fielded a few Surf Boat crews for the first time in many years and won the 120yrs male and female titles with the 160yrs male crew coming 3rd. The 120yrs female crew also won the ASRL Open event held in Stockton, NSW, earlier in the season



The Surf Boat section under the guidance of Boat Captain Jase "Molly" Bean and with the return of sweep Rick Estreich, saw the club field A Grade, Reserve Grade male crews and three Open Female crews. Along with the Masters crews, it was very rare to see a final being run this season where Mets were not represented. Rick's "Investa" women's crew also flew our colours with distinction in the Ocean Thunder series and was selected along with the Reserve Grade crew to represent Qld at the ASRL Open. In what must be a first, all three of our Open Women's crew's made the State final with my "Red" crew coming 2nd and Molly's "Queens of Kings" crew 3rd. This was on the back of all three crews and A Grade qualifying for the SLSQ Ocean Assault final with "Queens of Kings" coming 3rd. Not to be outdone, my A grade crew "White" took out the State Open Surf Boat Championship for the club for the first time since 1972 and went on to make the top 16 at Aussies.

Our board, ski, iron and swim competitors had an outstanding season. The swim section provided many highlights with the surf belt reel being dusted off after many years and what a comeback it was! Rebecca Creedy and her belt team won the Open Female inaugural State Championship and backed up with 3rd at Aussies. Notable performances by a couple of our young guns Sean McCullagh and Carl Perkins Jnr in the surf belt also suggest that our future in this arena looks very healthy. Strong performances in other swim events such as the Rescue Tube events and swim teams was topped off by Corey Jones collecting 3rd in the Open Male Surf Race at the Australian Championships.

Our U17 females competed with distinction all year with Kelly-Ann Perkins and Samantha Johnston in particular having a year to remember. Kelly-Ann won the U17 Ironwomen and combined with Samantha to also win the board rescue race at the State Championships. Samantha also came 2nd in both board and single ski races. They then continued their partnership to come 3rd in the board rescue at Aussies. As a group, the U17 females then combined to just miss the medals by coming 4th in both the Surf Teams and Taplin Relay in Scarborough. Corey and Chloe Jones finished 3rd in the Open Iron races at the SLSQ Ocean Assault final with Corey continuing this form coming 3rd in the Open Ironmen at States in what was a tremendous effort, and at Aussies, finishing a commendable 6th place.

It is always fantastic to see our competitors efforts recognised with representative selection. Congratulations to Corey Jones, Aimee Berridge, Kelly-Ann Perkins along with Rhett Collie (Head Coach) and Simon Richards (Assistant Team Manager) on their Queensland Team selection. Corey also had the honour of being selected in the Australian Representative Team.

In the Kellogg's Nutri Grain Series, both Corey and Chloe Jones did themselves and the club proud.

They continually performed in all conditions displaying the determination and skills required to compete at this elite level. The Coolum event saw Corey win the round and a second placing to Chloe capped off a remarkable day. I watched this on TV and it says a lot about both Corey and Chloe's character that their smiles of achievement said it all. Chloe's efforts in this arena are even more impressive considering this is her first year in Open competition.

In an effort to build up our beach competitor ranks the club has invested in the extra training of our younger members and the take up for this program was promising. Mets could still be found in the beach arena with Kieren and Kelly-Ann Perkins both winning their respective U17 2km Beach Run divisions at Aussies. For Kelly Ann, this now makes 3 years in a row and both she and Kieren are making this event their own.

Surf Rescue competition is another arena in which it was great to see the club represented this year and the development of all disciplines of competition for that matter is key to our continued growth.

I would like to also congratulate those competitors that who have continued to train hard and improved their performances over the last year, either individually or as part of a team event. You are part of a team that celebrates each other's success no matter how big or small and we look forward to your efforts again next year. I would also like to thank and congratulate Rhett Collie, our Head Coach, and his assistants for their continued commitment and dedication to our club and the members of the Surf Sports team. The results and improvements we have achieved as a team, and as individuals, is a credit to his professionalism and desire to get the best out of our athletes. His ability to develop not just quality athletes but also excellent members of our club is truly commendable.

A big thank you to all the Team Managers, in particular Simon Richards, who also takes on the administration of surf sports, and to the Nipper Crew, who by making so much of their time available, provide the opportunity for our kids to enjoy themselves in a competitive arena and develop into our future Surf Sports stars. Many thanks also to all the officials and water safety personnel who make it possible for the competitors to represent Mets. Your efforts and friendly faces are both welcome on the beach and very much appreciated.

With last years experience under the belt, we again travelled to Scarborough, Perth for the Nationals. It was a fantastic trip and it was great to enjoy each others company before and after the events at the team functions organised by a team of volunteers. Special thanks to NQX and Toll SPD who sponsored the transportation of our craft and gear, making the trip possible. On a personal note, I would also like to thank Geoff Phillips for his continued assistance and experience in packing the container, meaning our valuable gear gets back and forth without damage.



I have attempted to cover many of the exceptional performances displayed by our members this season. Please take the time to go through the complete Surf Sports results which illustrates the commitment the Surf Club makes to training and developing our athletes and it is a credit to all involved that at the Australian Championships; we won a total of 6 medals and 12 medals at the State Championships.

Unfortunately, I will not be running for the position of Director of Surf Sports again next year. It is not surprising that Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC has been nominated as the best youth development club in Queensland this season.

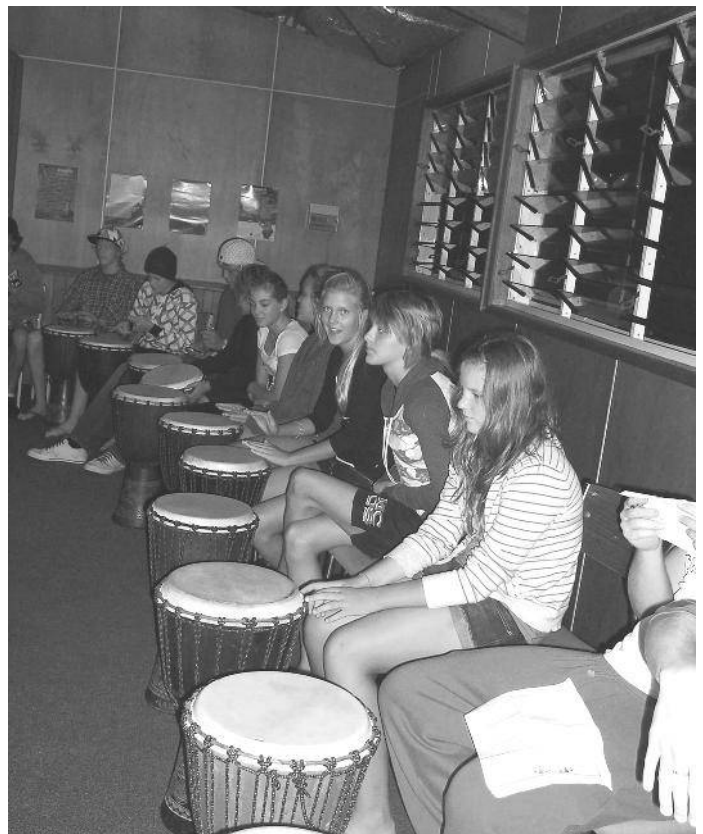
Congratulations to those members who took part in Branch and State Pelerman camps this year and in particular well done to Paula Ryan and Alice Llewelyn who won scholarships.

Welcome to the 2007/2008 Caloundra Surf Club annual report. The operation of your Supporter's Club this year has been affected by similar issues to last year with continually changing legislation plus the ongoing issue of the age of the clubhouse both impacting on trade. There was also the disadvantage of the inclement weather over the critical Christmas holiday period, with less than favourable weather conditions a factor experienced during most of the summer.

The matter of the extended lease area to include Spender Lane as part of the proposed redevelopment is closer, but still not totally resolved. Your President and Committee have been earnestly seeking to achieve the larger footprint of land required to expand the building, but suffice to say, this process is taking far longer than initially expected as the various conditions required by the Council and Department of Natural Resources and Mines are gradually being met. I commend those involved in the negotiations to date as they have shown great patience in dealing with the various layers of bureaucracy.

We have experienced better trade this year than last year with the restaurant leading the way with increased food revenue 13% ahead of 2007. The Supporter's Club has consistently proven that it is the eating venue of choice in the Kings Beach area with families and holiday-makers alike continuing to support the restaurant, often revisiting the club during while on vacation. The Club is constrained by its size and age of facilities but our customers have displayed their loyalty, often electing to wait for a table and enjoy the amenities in the Club, rather than going to another venue. Congratulations to the entire restaurant staff for another fabulous year.

The bar has also done well during the year experiencing a 6% increase on last year which also indicates that it is the staff and the fantastic location that attract customers to the Club, as there are a number of competing venues in the area which are newer and often closer to the units and other accommodation facilities.

Gaming has shown some growth in turnover being 8% ahead of the previous year although we are coming from a low base given the upheaval caused through the non-smoking legislation.

The Club has much less reliance on gaming than other Clubs and lacks amenities such as a kids area and better designated outdoor smoking areas, which should be rectified with any future redevelopment.

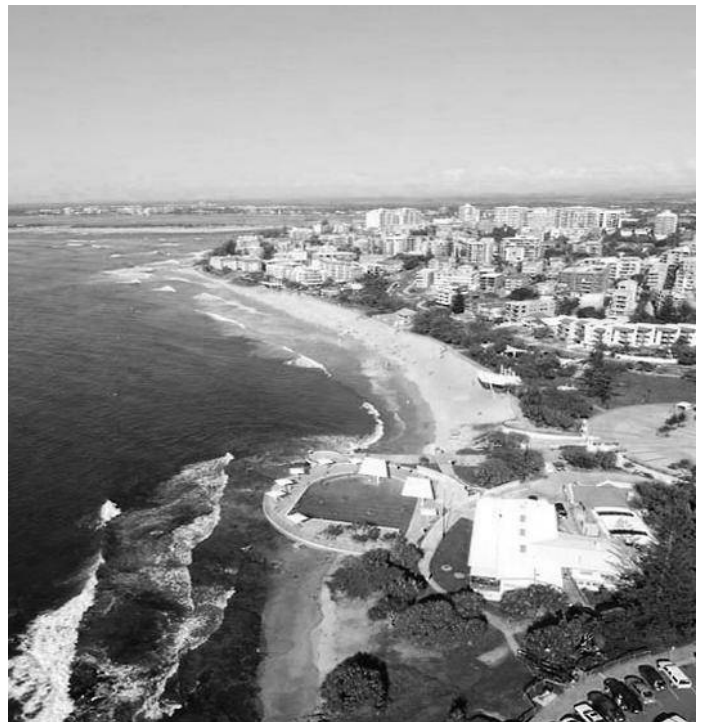
Once again the Supporter's Club team ably led by Julie Richards has continued to deliver excellent service in a venue that is becoming harder to maintain, and in the Kings Beach precinct which is becoming increasingly competitive. The operating cash profit for the year of approximately \$205,000 has increased by \$18,600 on the previous year, which is an exceptional result under the circumstances.

I would like to express my gratitude to the Supporter's Club Committee which has continued to give the whole management team its total support. Also I recently had the privilege to attend the Surf Girl awards and the spirit and enthusiasm of the Surf Life Saving members who attended was amazing - it is extremely pleasing to see such strength in both organisations and the Surf Life Saving Committee should be commended. Thanks also to the RSL Services Club Committee for their ongoing support which to date in monetary terms, equates to \$500,000 in donated management fees back to Surf Life Saving over the past six years.

To you the Members and Supporters another huge vote of appreciation - without your continued patronage we would not have achieved the much improved trading results mentioned above.

(a) Income Tax

Net income of the Association is taxable to the extent that non-member receipts exceed non-member expenses. Any net income arising from receipts from members is not taxable.

(b) Property, Plant & Equipment

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

(c) Inventories

Inventories are measured at cost. Costs are assigned on a first-in, first-out basis.

(d) Leases

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not legal ownership, are transferred to the Association, are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised recording the asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Leased assets are amortised over their estimated useful lives. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the leases interest expense for the period.

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.




