

Finance and property

I have only taken this position on since January to assist the committee with statutory obligations and minimize costs in relation to the end of year and audit. At the time of writing this report, the final audited figures were not available.

Nevertheless, I can report that it has been a difficult year financially for the club. Some of the main abnormal items for the year were:

- Downstairs renovations costing more than \$20,000;
- 75th Anniversary going over budget due to less than expected attendance (300 was still a great turnout);
- House to house collections were down on previous years; and
- No Surf Girl, which in turn led to reduced overall fundraising.

However, seasons like this also make the committee look more closely at the finances of the club and cut costs and increase revenue where possible. In light of the global economic crisis, a few items that the new committee will need to look at are:

- Ensure professional staff costs are controlled;
- Reinvigorate the drive for more sponsors;
- Less reliance on the Supporters Club for financial support;
- If we have a Surf Girl campaign, do not budget for their fundraising to be part of the core income. Instead, this money should be on top of anything else raised;
- Implement an asset replacement schedule, so items such as IRB's, motors and surf boats can be rolled over at the best time; and
- Look for other income streams.

There has also been a major adjustment made this financial year in relation to expenses, both capital and maintenance that the Supporters Club has incurred over the past few years in relation to the building. As the building is 'owned' by the surf club, we have taken on these expenses in 2008/2009 and have offset them against the loan between the two entities.



A big thank you to all of our sponsors, especially our major sponsor INVESTA, who all continue to support our club in these difficult times.

Many thanks to the staff or volunteers who have assisted with the financials over the past 12 months. Due to my work commitments, I cannot continue in this position for 2009/2010, but I will offer my assistance to whoever does.

Marketing and sponsorship

Fundraising

I would like to particularly thank Fiona Innes, Simon Richards, the Creedy boys, John Keller and the Perkins family. The biggest thanks of all goes to Gary Jones, for cooking at all the barbecues and organising the area, Cathy Dick who ensured the drinks were supplied and ready, and Jill Ware (mum) for organising all the food and counting all the money from the fundraising events.

In addition to the barbecues, Jonesy has also done a fantastic job in organising the chocolates and selling the majority of these for the club.

Boardies Day was a fundraiser that saw a number of businesses and schools in the Caloundra community get involved with raising money for the club. Thanks to Chloe Jones for talking at some of the schools about surf safety—I am sure that the students got a real kick out of meeting a “Kellogg’s Nutrigrain Ironwoman”. Lifesaving

Club Captain

Despite having been vice-captain for the past two years, tackling Club Captain for the first time has been challenging, rewarding and definitely a massive learning curve! After getting off to a shaky start (re-writing the entire patrol roster just one week into the season is not anyone's idea of fun) we hit the ground running performing over 120 rescues and more than 1,500 preventative actions warning more than 6,500 people! Even though the number of rescues performed was not as high as the previous season, it is still well above average and an increase in preventative actions shows that we continue to deliver a high standard of service to the public.

One of the more interesting rescues to occur this season is that of a local furry friend—the wallaby that lived on the headland. Although a bit of a difficult customer, he was safely brought to shore and collected by staff from Australia Zoo. We later discovered that the local council had been trying to catch the sneak for at least 8 months to relocate him away from a residential area—well done to all involved!

Congratulations, 75 years of vigilance and service

Thousands of dedicated members of the Metropolitan Caloundra Surf Life Saving Club have patrolled Kings Beach since the club's first official patrol on the 13th October 1933.

Many inaugural members came from the Metropolitan Life Saving Club, which patrolled Ocean Beach on Bribie Island. At the request of the local council, this Bribie-based club performed patrols on Kings Beach during Christmas and New Year holiday periods and eventually Easter from 1924 until October 1933 when the newly formed Metropolitan Caloundra Surf Life Saving Club took over these duties.

On the weekend of 10th to the 12th of October 2008 current and past members of Mets, as we like to call ourselves, proudly celebrated the 75th anniversary of our club's origins.

Photographs and displays of memorabilia, trophies, and clothing were presented in the heritage listed Pavilion at Kings Beach during the course of the weekend.

Past members travelled from as far a field as Darwin, Townsville, Sydney and Melbourne to attend the reunion celebrations. The casual get together at the clubhouse on the Friday evening enabled many a tall story to be told and encouraged just as many sore heads the following morning.

By midday Saturday most had recovered enough to participate in a photo session and enjoy the hospitality of current members who put on a sausage sizzle in the courtyard.

The big affair of the weekend was the Reunion Dinner at the Events Centre on the Saturday night. Close to 300 members past and present, sponsors, and specially invited guests were treated to a wonderful opening dance routine performed by students of the Caloundra State High School.

The evening continued with the premiere presentation of a DVD especially shot for the 75th celebrations. We were also honored to have the company of Mr Ron Rankin AM, President of SLISA and his wife Sue. Our Life Governor, Mr Des Dwyer OAM accepted a plaque presented by Ron to commemorate this most auspicious milestone.

Mr Ralph Devlin, as anticipated, performed admirably in his duties as master of ceremonies and kept the guests enthralled with his comedic quips.

With the formalities over, the night concluded with dancing, more catching up with long lost friends, and further tales of a time gone by.

Sunday morning breakfast at the clubhouse was a much more subdued event and a final opportunity to enjoy the company of friends both old and new. There was a definite feeling of sadness that it was all over.



These 75th anniversary celebrations were an occasion to not only look back on the wonderful past achievements of our club, but also to look optimistically to the future. While there continues to be generous, dedicated members who volunteer to patrol the beach, sit on committees, undertake fundraising activities and generally put their hand up to help, Metropolitan Caloundra Surf Lifesaving Club will go from strength to strength in the next 75 years. Like Digger, we will be able to reflect lifelong on happy memories of our own time at Mets.

Our surf sports competitors have had an extremely full calendar this 2008–2009 season, and as always they can be proud of the way they represented the Metropolitan Caloundra Surf Life Saving Club in the competition arena. Our surf sports team has once again excelled in most disciplines, resulting in positive media coverage for our club and sponsors.

The IRB team kicked off their short but busy season in May, with carnivals on the Gold Coast, Sunshine Coast and Hervey Bay. The Queensland State Championships were held at Dicky Beach SLSC and the team took home two medals, 2nd in the female teams rescue and 2nd in the masters tube rescue. The Australian IRB Championships were held at Shell Harbour, NSW in June. Competition was fierce and the team missed out on making several finals by the smallest of margins. It was great to see our two female teams were again extremely competitive.

The masters competitors again grew in strength and numbers which showed in the results that they achieved at the Queensland State Championships. Seven medals were won: the 120 years female surfboat were 1st: Steve Bacon, Michael Stewart, Stuart Cordingley and Alan Macklin placed 2nd in their respective events: and 3rd place for Glen Forbes, Jeffrey Morris and the 150 years surfboat. Well done to all.

The surfboats were again a strong contingent, fielding three open female crews, as well as a masters, open and a reserve grade crew. They were swept by Mick Bacon, Jase ‘Molly’ Bean and Rick Estreich. The women were by far the success story, winning three State medals (1st and two 2nds) and 1st place at the Australian Masters Surf Life Saving Championships at Scarborough. It has been great to see our surfboat section go from strength to strength and I hope their next season will be even better.

Our surf sports competitors- board, ski, iron and swim, have had another outstanding year under the expert guidance of our club coach, Rhett Collie and team manager, Simon Richards. The countless hours of hard training has paid off, with many outstanding results being achieved from our under 15 to open competitors. The Queensland Championships at Kawana saw our team win eight medals, with Kelly-Anne Perkins winning the U17 iron woman for the second successive year, Cameron Smith placing 2nd in the U15 board race and Rebecca Creedy placing 3rd in the female surf belt and surf race. Well done to all the competitors who competed at the Queensland Championships, the club placed 9th overall.

The Australian Surf Lifesaving Championships at Scarborough in March produced a mixed bag of results. Congratulations must go to Keiren Perkins for winning the U17 male 2km surf beach run. Rebecca Creedy also had an outstanding carnival, placing 8th in the open ironwoman, 4th in the open female surf race and 4th in the open ski. Cameron Smith will hopefully be one of our young upcoming competitors and displayed this by placing 6th in both the U15 board race and 2^{km} beach run.

This year’s Kellogg’s Nutri Grain series saw Corey Jones, Chloe Jones and Rebecca Creedy qualify. It was great to see Rebecca qualify in her first year as an open female ironwoman, the long winter training sessions paid off, as can be seen by her final results. All three competitors did themselves and the club proud especially in the difficult conditions they faced in round three at Coolum. Corey placed 5th overall, qualifying him automatically for next year’s series. Rebecca Creedy placed 9th and Chloe Jones 12th. It must be emphasised that results like these can only be achieved by the countless hours of training and hard work these athletes put in.

Congratulations must go to all those competitors who have competed for Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC this season, whether is be as an individual or as part of a team. I feel very strongly that competition especially at team level breeds success for our club as a whole in both memberships and patrols.



I must thank all the team managers, officials and water safety who dedicate their free time, so that our club members can compete. The time and effort these people provide is very much appreciated. The countless hours that both Simon Richards (team manager) and Rhett Collie (head coach) dedicate to Mets must be applauded and appreciated. 


Figure 1: Membership analysis 2000-01 to 2008-09

Note 1: Statement of significant accounting policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Queensland Associations Incorporations Act 1981. The Committee as determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Queensland Associations Incorporations Act 1981, and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AASB 112: Income Taxes
AASB 1031: Materiality
AASB 110: Events Occurring After Reporting Date
AASB 117: Leases

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Boards have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous report period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report:

a) Income Tax

The club is exempt from Income Tax in accordance with Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

b) Property, Plant and Equipment

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

c) Inventories

Inventories are measured at cost. Costs are assigned on a first-in, first-out basis.

d) Leases

Leases of fixed assets, whether finance leases or operating leases, are expensed in the periods in which they are incurred.

e) Goods and Services tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.

f) Prepayments

Prepayments have been brought to account for insurance premiums for the first time in the 2008 year, previous to which they were expensed in the year of payment.


