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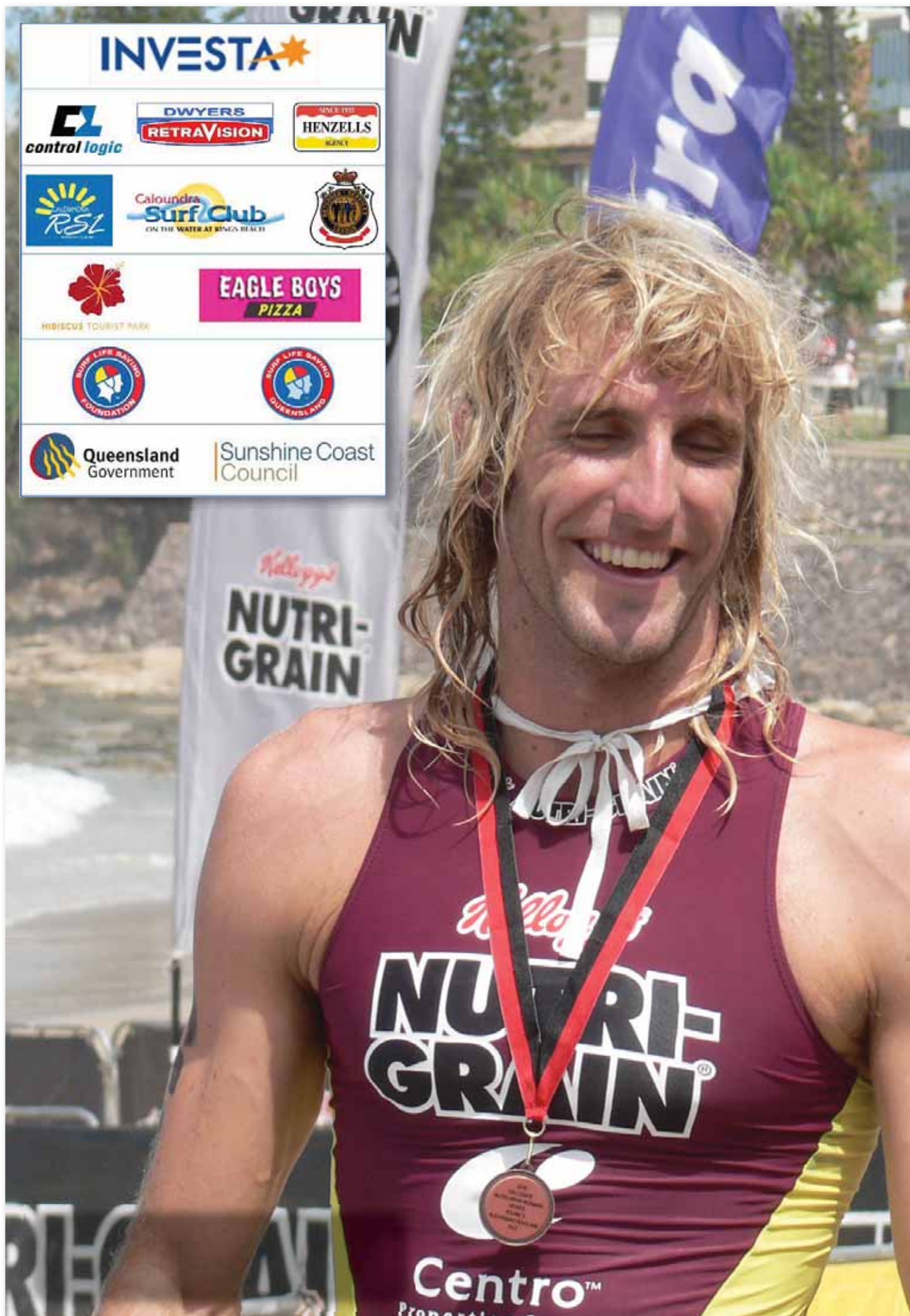

FINANCE & PROPERTY REPORT

The Club's Board of Management (BoM) was well aware that it had to address the financial position of the Club from the difficulties of the previous year. We set out to achieve the following objectives.

- 1) Set a budget for the financial year.
- 2) Contain expenses.
- 3) Increase revenue.
- 4) Reduce Club debt.
- 5) Provide accurate and timely financial reporting to the BoM.

I am happy to report that we have improved in all the above areas this year and this has resulted in a good financial result. Listed below is an overview of the 2009/10 financial year for your Club.

Revenue.

Through the efforts of Neil Anderson our budgets were exceeded in the Surf Appeals and we maintained the support of our major sponsor Investa. A special mention to our Surf Girl Amy Blokkeerus whose efforts raised \$31,683.44 for the Club. Thank you Amy. The challenge for the incoming BoM is to build on this base for next year.

Expense Control.

The BoM accepted and implemented a Club Purchasing Policy for all to follow. This policy required official Club orders to be raised for all purchases except where work place health and safety was involved. It is pleasing to report that the Club members have supported this policy and it has helped in the control of expenditure.

Cash Flow.

As a result of the above two items the Club's operating bank balance is a positive \$75,893. This is \$41,123 better than this time last year. The Club's Foundation account continues to operate outside of the day to day cash flow of the Club and currently stands at \$154,134.

The Club's Accounts Payable and Accounts Receivable are all current and up to date and are in good condition to hand over to the new BoM.

Property.

The main asset of the Club is the building that the Supporters Club operates and we have continued to receive an income on a monthly basis. This income has been off set against a loan to the Supporters Club which was fully repaid during the year. A Lease Agreement has been signed by the Supporters Club to formalize the monthly payment now as a rent payment. This currently stands at \$10,000 per month but with a clause in the lease agreement to negotiate a yearly increase. An upgraded entrance from the beach side was carried out during the year and paid for by the Supporters Club.

A Redevelopment Committee has been established with the appropriate expertise to look at the options for a future redevelopment of our facilities.

Profit 2009/2010.

The 12 months operating profit for the Club before depreciation and auditors adjustments is \$57,623. This is a pleasing result and a considerable turn around on last year's loss. The Depreciation Expenses for the Club are \$73,298 which includes an amount of \$22,803 "Loss on Disposal of Assets" These old assets that are no longer in use with the Club and have been written off.

I would like to thank the BoM and the RSL Club for the support they gave me in the Treasurers responsibilities. A very special "Thank you" to Kay Blokkeerus, our Administration Manager, who battles with the very busy day to day activities of our Club. I am confident that the Club can build on the base that has been established this year and I wish the incoming BoM all the success for the coming season.

We achieved our targets for both collections, and raised over \$30,000. Special thanks to Suzanne Bishop for giving up both of your weekends to count the funds as they came in, to Isaac Cox, John Keller & Lance Hipkin for running the show in Brisbane over the Surf Rescue appeal weekend. Also to the nipper families, particularly those of you who only joined our club this season, it was great to see your club spirit in supporting us in such great numbers this year.

As I mentioned earlier we had great turn outs at the club BBQ's this season. It was fantastic to see so much support from our members across the board from our nipper families all the way through to the masters and old boys. These BBQ's are extremely important to not only our clubs financial success but even more importantly for club moral. Lifesaving Report

This has been our busiest season this decade with a total of 210 rescues performed in the 2009-2010 patrolling season! Preventative actions were again well over 1,000 with nearly 10,000 beach-goers and swimmers warned before requiring assistance.

After having a lovely start, our rescue statistics show that the end of the season was particularly busy. Cyclone Ului whipped up some huge conditions and caused our beach to be closed for 13 hours in March. With the continued foul weather, over 100 tube rescues were logged in April - that is more tube rescues in one month than have been completed for some entire seasons for the last 10 years! Well done to all our active members for your commitment to keeping visitors to Kings Beach safe throughout some very trying conditions.

Although Buhk Wilkes results are not available yet, the patrols that were inspected performed to a very high standard – you should be proud! I can't help but share a phone call I received in January from Steve Bacon tentatively enquiring as to what I (as Club Captain) would deem to be acceptable points score for a patrol inspection before he would share the results. All inspected patrols did extremely well.

We had 3 close calls with near drowning this season; luckily all were sent on to hospital and to the best of our knowledge have made full recoveries. Unfortunately there was a drowning late in the season during the week at Happy Valley – a tragic reminder of just how dangerous the Caloundra Bar can be.

One of the more interesting events (or lack of eventfulness) was testing out the State warning system for a tsunami. Although in the long run the potential tsunami from a huge earthquake off the coast of Chile appeared to completely bypass Australia, it was good to see how our emergency services can work together to make sure that people are kept safe in the face of a possible huge disaster.

We were visited regularly by the Surf Patrol crew this season, and our club has already featured prominently in episodes that have aired so far. The feedback from the production company and the camera crew is always positive; they continue to be impressed with the level of professionalism and passion members of our club show when they are on patrol.

Patrol captains – you are fantastic! Managing the beach (and sometimes a patrol team) is never an easy position but you all handle it with great dedication and tremendous spirit. Thank you to you and all our members for volunteering your time and skills.

Big thank you to Robbie Schwartz for his brilliant work continuing on as our First Aid Officer, Dan and James Creedy for your IRB expertise and Snow Maurice and Barry Thomas for all your help with vehicles, radios, gear and equipment – without the efforts of these guys there is a massive amount of behind-the-scenes stuff that just wouldn't have been done this season. I really appreciate and value your hard work and commitment to the club and lifesaving in general.

To my patrol team – I love you guys! I don't think I've ever seen the boat shed so clean - thanks for not complaining that I rostered us on for the last patrol of the season (again!). I'll see what I can do to make sure someone else has a turn next year...

Training & Assessment Report

It is my pleasure to present the Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC Training and Assessment Report for Season 2009/10. Another surf life saving season has come to an end. A big thanks goes to all our trainers and assessors for their efforts in ensuring our members are achieving the standard required to provide a quality service to members of the public visiting Kings Beach.

Proficiencies

The proficiency procedure (workbooks + practical) is into its 2nd year, with the major change being the introduction of Marine Stinger Management which had previously only applied to North Queensland. It is yet to be confirmed, but from next season members who do not hold a Defibrillation Certificate will probably be required to do a Defibrillation Awareness Unit as part of the proficiency. How we do this without overly extending the time required for proficiency day is yet to be determined.

I would like to thank all of our members for their patience on proficiency days. It was amazing how quickly we could get through everything when every member just got on with the job.

Bronze Medallion

It is always a pleasure to see young and not so young people taking the first step in surf lifesaving by qualifying for their Bronze Medallion. This year, as well as our usual number of training squads, we added a Uni squad which ran similarly to the annual September camp. This squad was not restricted to university students but was open only to over 18s. A big thanks goes to Amy and Rachel who not only came up with the idea but followed through to make it a successful course. And if Mark B wants to cater for every course I do, I certainly won't be complaining.

The Bronze Medallion is the most difficult award to achieve in surf lifesaving but opens the door to further awards. For the 2009/10 season the club trained 36 successful candidates for their bronze medallion. This included three additions to our List of International Bronzies.

Our first (to my knowledge) was Massimo Donalisio in the 07/08 season and he was followed this season by Stefano Pagliai & Matthias Sperka from the USA and Gustave Burguet from France. All have left our country proudly wearing the Met Caloundra colours.

Congratulations to the new members of Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC and those members upgrading from their Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) for their efforts.

Congratulations also go to all those who participated in courses to achieve their Surf Rescue Certificate this year. Next step is your Bronze!

IRB Crewman/Driver

A very pleasing note this season was that close to half of our new Bronzies went on to achieve their Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB) crewman award. In addition to this, we will also have four new IRB drivers for next season. Congratulations to all participants and big thanks to Dan and James Creedy and their able assistants for their efforts.

Operational First Aid

Thanks to the efforts of Liz Dawes we were able to run an Operational First Aid and OFA Upgrade course towards the end of the season. We now have 4 new First Aid officers and 6 members who are proficient for another 3 years.

Other awards

6 members completed or are in the process of completing their Skills Trainer Award. One member, Peter (Snow) Maurice, is only one course away from his Training Officers Award.

9 of our Under 13s achieved their Basic Resuscitation Certificate.

3 members achieved the Silver Medallion Basic Beach Management.

I would also like to congratulate the Nipper Age Managers for achieving both Age Manager Award and where required their Observers Award. Thank you to Liz and Tracey for running this course.

Finally I would like to thank the Management Committee, Club Captain Paula Ryan, Club Supervisor Liz Dawes, Office Staff (Kay, Amy and Rachel) and all the Trainers and Assessors for the time and effort they have put into the club this year and the assistance I have been given. The Metropolitan Caloundra Surf Sports team had another successful year in most disciplines and represented our club with commitment and sportsmanship which the team, supporters and club as whole should be proud of.

While everyone was off having a break from the beach, the determined IRB team spent most of the winter months at carnivals. The team performed remarkably throughout the season, but narrowly missed a medal at the Australian Titles with Dan and James Creedy coming a close fourth.

Racing for the 2009-2010 season kicks off this May with the introduction of the Ocean Roar IRB Premiership Series, and State Championships set to be held at Broadbeach in July. The team decided not to compete in the 2010 Australian IRB Championships at Penguin Beach (Too cold!), Tasmania in April.

The club has a committed group of members competing in our board, swim, ski and iron events and had an outstanding season. The State Titles at Kurrawa were the highlight of the season with 3 Gold, 3 Silver and 4 Bronze medals ranging from outstanding individual results from Corey Jones in the Open Ironman & Open Male Surf Race, Rebecca Creedy in the Open Female Surf Race & Open Ironwoman, Kieren Perkins in the Open Male 2km Beach Run and Kelly-Ann Perkins in the U19 Female Board Race. It was fantastic to see Mets competing in team events where we also won Bronze medals in the Open Female Taplin and Open Lifesaver Relay which was an excellent result for our club and a great team effort. Our athletes also competed at the Queensland Endurance Champs at the start of the season with medals in most disciplines and age groups.

The Surf Boat section provided some excellent results throughout the season. Most notable was the Open Men's boat swept by Mick Bacon securing Bronze at the State Tiles and also being part of the successful Lifesaver Relay team. Also at States Mick's 160yrs Masters crew picked up Silver while his Open Women's crew showed consistency to finish 3rd in the Aussie-bum premiership. This season saw Greg Bacon start sweeping and he and his Reserve Grade crew applied themselves very well in particular towards the tail end of the season where the surf tested everyone's skills. Lead by there fearless leader or as he is generally known Team Manager Peter Otago the boaties also attended the ASRL Open in Wollongong where Jase Bean's Masters crew picked up a Silver in what could only be described as mountainous conditions. Last but not least congratulations to Jase and his Women's crew who flew Mets colours as part of a team which won the George Bass Marathon in southern NSW.

The Club had a great start to the Australian Titles held at Kurrawa on day 1 with Kieren and Kelly-Ann Perkins both winning their Under 19 2km beach runs, which is their fourth successive Gold medal in this event. Due to the tragic death of Queenscliff lifesaver Saxon Bird competition was cancelled.

In the Kellogg's Nutri-Grain Series we also had a strong presence with Corey Jones finishing 5th overall and qualifying for next year and Rebecca Creedy finishing 7th overall whilst Kelly-Ann Perkins utilized the Friday wildcard qualifying sessions to compete in 4 of the 5 rounds and finish 19th overall.

Congratulations to Rebecca Creedy who has been selected in the SLSA High Performance Squad.

Corey and Chloe Jones with the support of Team Manager Simon Richards will be representing the club at the Lifesaving World Championships - Rescue 2010 taking place in the coastal city of Alexandria in Egypt from 2 to 17 October 2010. Pool Events will take place in the Olympic Swimming Pool of Alexandria and Ocean events will take place in Mamoura Beach. Over 3,000 athletes and more then 1,000 delegates, officials and team managers will be in attendance.

I would also like to congratulate those competitors that have continued to train hard and improve their performances over the last year. You are part of a team which celebrates each other's success no matter how big or small and we look forward to your efforts next year. I would also like to thank and congratulate Rhett Collie, our Head Coach and his assistants for their continued efforts and dedications to our club.

I would like to thank all the Team Managers, in particular Simon Richards and Cheryl de Malmanche, who also take on the administration of surf sports with carnival nominations. Many thanks also the officials and water safety personnel who make it possible for our Surf Sports team to compete and your friendly faces at carnivals are appreciated.

A big thank you also to all the people that make our Nipper Surf Sports possible by dedicating so much time to ensure our kids develop in a fun and safe environment to be our future Surf Sport stars. We look forward to the continued growth of the squad and transition into lifesavers.

I have attempted to cover many exceptional performances by our Surf Sports team this season but please take the time to go through the complete results which illustrates the commitment the Surf Club makes to training and development of our members.

This may take several more years to accomplish and during that time, the Supporters' Club will need to embark on a programme of modest, but continuous refurbishment in order to attract new patrons as well as retain our existing clientele.

Only by doing so, can we continue to be a viable, strategic funding source for the Surf Club.

Speaking of refurbishment, - much of our planning for next year revolves around refreshing the facilities, and improving both the internal and external aesthetics of the club. In particular, we want to create a "feel" within the club that is truly reflective of Surf Life Saving and one that faithfully conveys the proud history of "Mets".

Many of you will have noticed that, as this year progressed, honour boards and historical photographs started returning to walls of the Supporters Club. You can expect further progress on this over the next twelve months as well as some slightly more "dynamic" additions to enhance the club's ambience and maintain patrons' interest.

While the gains we've made this year are modest, they are nonetheless significant and none of those would have been possible without the support, commitment and enthusiasm of my fellow committee members. Gentleman, you have my sincere thanks and it's my genuine wish that you continue your involvement next year... Please!

This year's performance is also the result of hard work and dedication from the RSL team and all the staff of the Supporters' Club.

To Steve, Julie, Tracey and all the guys and girls "upstairs", - many thanks! We look forward to working with you to build on this year's results over the next twelve months.

In closing, I'd just like to encourage all club members to use the Supporters' Club at every opportunity. The food is exceptional, the facilities are improving, and the view is fantastic! It's your club and you are always welcome.

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Queensland Associations Incorporations Act 1981. The Committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous report period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report:

a) *Income Tax*

The club is exempt from Income Tax in accordance with Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

b) *Property, Plant and Equipment*

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

c) *Inventories*

Inventories are measured at cost. Costs are assigned on a first-in, first-out basis.

d) *Leases*

Leases of fixed assets, whether finance leases or operating leases, are expensed in the periods in which they are incurred.

e) *Goods and Services tax*

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Balance Sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

f) *Prepayments*

Prepayments have been brought to account for insurance premiums in line with their treatment in the prior year.

g) *Employee Benefits*

Provision is made for the entity's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

The Committee's responsibilities also include designing, implementing and maintaining internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error; selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies; and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used, as described in Note 1, are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. These Auditing Standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the Committee, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

The financial report has been prepared for distribution to members for the purpose of fulfilling the Committee's financial reporting under the Queensland Associations Incorporation Act 1981. We disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the financial report to which it relates to any person other than the members, or for any purpose other than that for which it was prepared.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Independence

In conducting our audit, we have complied with the independence requirements of Australian professional ethical pronouncements.

Basis for Qualified Auditor's Opinion

a) A substantial amount of the Club's income is derived from collections, donations and other general fund-raising activities. As is the case of similar organisations, it was impracticable to extend our examination of income derived from these activities beyond that information which is recorded in the books of account.



b) The Club has a policy of purchasing various items of equipment which are provided to members to assist with their lifesaving training (e.g. surf skis, boards). This equipment is not directly controlled by the Club, although recognised in the books of account as an asset. We have not been able to conduct physical inspection of these assets and cannot verify their existence or their value.
