Des joined Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC in the 1948-1949 season and obtained his Bronze Medallion the following year. He was awarded Life Membership in the 1958-1959 season. Over a number of years Des held various positions in the club including Club Captain, Vice-Captain, President, Deputy President, Chief Gear Steward and Vice Patron; and most notably Life Governor since 2002.

Des was also the Branch Superintendent for instruction and examination and heavily involved in many aspects of surf sports.

Des was a proud boatie and with fellow members rowed the Surf Boat from Brisbane to Caloundra. Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC thought so highly of Des that a Surf Boat was named in his honour "The Des Dwyer".

Des was a passionate and successful member of March Past and R and R Teams and this also later saw him coach various teams.

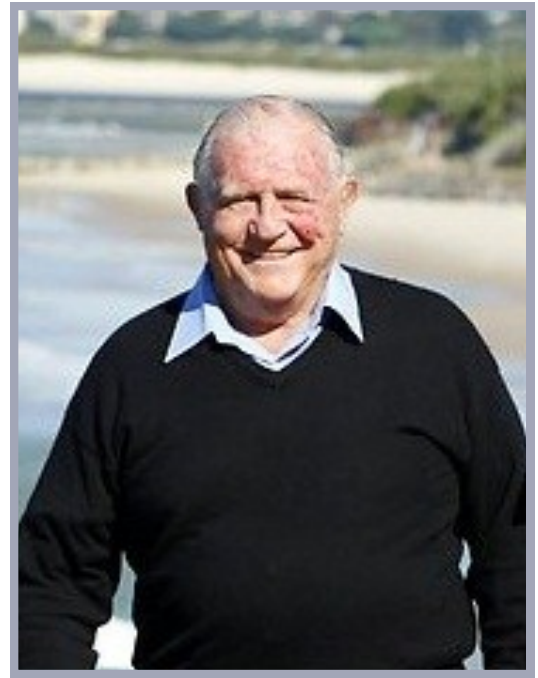
Des received his OAM for his service to Surf Life Saving and Local Government.

President



When I took on the role of President at the 2012 Annual General Meeting, I spoke of setting a vision and goal that within three years, we would be the recognised premier mid tier surf lifesaving club on the North Coast.

At the 2013 AGM, we spoke of the challenges and visions we had for the forthcoming year, and it certainly has been both a taxing and an enjoyable year. Given where we are now at, and the desire and team work we have within the club, I believe we have achieved a lot, even recognising there was pain along the way.

We are all part of this journey, and therefore I urge everyone to read the reports presented by the other members of the Board within our annual report, as each and every one of them have detailed our accomplishments and the way forward.

2013-2014 to me was a year of consolidation. At our 2013 AGM, we discussed the issues we could foresee going forward, and how we had to bring our house from a financial viewpoint into order. This required some very hard decisions by all members of the Board of Management; it also impacted on a number of members throughout the year, who either queried why we were doing things, or just did not agree with certain decisions.

Part of this process was we were not able to continue with the services of our Surf Sports Coach, as well as having to reduce dramatically the administration team hours and numbers. However out of this process, I have seen what so many in our community call the Aussie spirit. Our Surf Sports Director and then JAC President, rightly voiced their concerns at the AGM; yet these people were the first to jump in and help fill the hole left by the Surf Sports Coach leaving, by taking over courses etc. So many Nipper parents came forward and asked us how they could help. Parents who were not happy with the decisions then turned around and came in and helped. To you, I thank you sincerely.

From a lifesaving viewpoint, our overall surf lifesaving goal has again been achieved, being that we did not have a fatality or drowning between our flags this season on Kings Beach. The level of professionalism by our patrolling members were very high, and were lifted, by the efforts and determination of our Club and Vice Captain, Captain, Chief Training Officer, examiners, trainers etc. We have had not only a large increase in Bronze members, but also in the area of IRB crewing and driving.

The area of Surf Sports was dramatically impacted by some of the matters I touched on above. We have lost a number of major competitors, but as I said before, we are now back at the base level. Now we will continue to rebuild and put effort and processes into place to help take us back to the senior level. To our master's, surf boat, nipper and IRB competitors, thank you for all your efforts and the position you have taken the Club within the competitive arena.

The Junior's have had a good year, and the enthusiasm and development displayed by this section of our club under the direction of Phil Ashworth, Director of Junior Activities, must be congratulated. Again they were disrupted by the decisions touched on by me previously, but they have grown and developed from there, thanks to all the Nipper parents and other people whom I have mentioned.

Our surf girl entrant, Karlee Bryant, was well supported throughout the year by her committee, the Director of Marketing and Sponsorship and a number of our club members. Karlee made us proud at the Surf Girl dinner, although the colour of her moon boot she had to wear via an IRB accident, did not match the colour of her dress. Well done Karlee and thank you.

We have some major achievements to be proud of this season:

Operational Level

- The awards achieved, please see the report by Chief Training Officer
- We achieved an overall retention rate of 102%, with juniors and cadets achieving a rate in excess of 100%
- Obtaining of grants allowing improvements in training and IRB facilities

Strategic Level

- Redevelopment of training room, clubhouse, shower and toilet facilities and dormitories.
- Funding approval received re Supporter Club redevelopment and commencement of process

Planning and Administration

It is with much pleasure that I present the Annual Report and Financial Statements for the 2013-2014 season. Firstly, let me offer an apology for the 'look and feel' of the report. As one of our cost savings measures implemented this season, the report was completed 'in-house' by volunteers, which saved a considerable amount of money for staff and/or an external publishing company. But as a result, the report lacks some of the quality you would receive from a dedicated publishing company. I will now provide a brief snapshot of some of the key areas from the season.

The first priority on taking on the position, was to ascertain the actual financial position of the Club and prepare a budget for the remainder of the season. With the AGM in July, unfortunately we were already 3 months into the financial year, so in some respects the decisions we had to make were even tougher. A draft budget was prepared and presented to the Finance and Administration Committee, which showed an \$80,000 cash shortfall if we continued on the same path. As a result the Committee had to make some tough decisions in regards to expenditure and staffing levels. The Board of Management then endorsed the 2013/2014 budget.

As a result, the cost of administrative staff were cut by more than 50% from last season, even taking into account the full expense for the three months to July. Therefore, more work was required to be completed by volunteers and I would like to thank those members that stepped up to the plate and helped out whenever required. Thanks to Kay Blokkeerus, Margot Rousell and Amy Blokkeerus for their efforts despite the heavily reduced hours.

The second decision that was made was the change in employment conditions for our professional surf sports coach, Rhett Collie. With no other options presented to the Board, the difficult decision was made to make his full time position redundant and offer him a casual role. Unfortunately, Rhett was not in a position to accept the new role and departed the Club in September 2013. As someone that was involved in the recruitment of Rhett in 2004, I am fully aware that the decision was difficult for some members. The Board must act in the best interests of the Club and the short term financial viability of the Club had to take precedence. I would like to thank Rhett for his service to the Club over the past 9 years.

Whilst the 2013-2014 season was all about reducing costs as much as possible, we now need to place more emphasis on the more difficult task of increasing revenue. Despite these changes, the Club continued to perform its main duty of patrolling Kings Beach and the surrounding areas.

A big thank you to the Building Sub-Committee of Alan Macklin, Craig Spender and John Buchanan. As a result of their efforts and the support of many others, the Club was able to obtain a 20 year lease over our land, complete an outstanding refurbishment of the downstairs life saving area and obtain finance for the refurbishment of the Supporters Club. These are 3 things that have been 'talked' about for more than 20 years and have now come to fruition.



Planning and Administration

Our membership this season stayed steady with good numbers in the Junior Activities ranks. Membership recruitment will need to be a focus in the next few years if we are to grow our patrol teams and ease the burden for all members. For the first time in many years, I believe that we are on the right track with the 'one club, one cap' concept. You only have to turn up to nippers on a Sunday morning and see the amount of 'senior' club members assisting on the beach in various roles. To Phill Ashworth and Brett Magnussen and your band of helpers, it has been a pleasure to have you on board this season. The standard that you have set in Nippers is to be commended.

One of the common 'complaints' I heard last year was that our communication with members was poor. We overused items such as SMS, but did not use enough of social media. As such, we have been quite proactive in using our Facebook page to promote our beautiful beach and in particular our members and their successes. The number of page likes has more than doubled this season, and we have had a lot more interaction from our members. Our website was updated during the off season, but we will be working on some minor tweaks next season to enable easier use. We will also look at refreshing our online newsletter.

Well done to our Conrad Jupiters Summer Surf Girl entrant Karlee Bryant for representing the Club for the 2013-2014 season. Your interview and presentation at the Gala Ball in May was up there with the best, and certainly came from the heart.

They say behind every man is a great lady, and my sincere thanks to Kerri Dick, who took on the role of Assistant Secretary during the season. Kerri assisted capably when I was away for 3 weeks and took on more basic administrative duties, so that I could continue to assist in other areas.

This season was definitely about going back to basics. Hopefully, in the next few years, we can build on the difficult decisions that were made and grow our Club in a sensible and financially stable way.

Finance and Property

The 2013-2014 season has not only been a difficult one but also a rewarding one for the Club and the Board of Management.

Difficult, because the BOM had to make a number of decisions and although they were not pleasant, (surf coach no longer employed and greatly reducing the office staff hours) these were in the best long term interest of the Club and its members.

Rewarding as not only did the Club membership numbers stay steady this season, they actually rose a little. The Club also received a major grant to refurbish downstairs and the Club had also been successful in applying for a major loan through Westpac to refurbish upstairs. Overall it was a good season for the Club.

As you all may be aware that to get us through the end of last season we sought financial assistance from the Club Foundation Committee seeking an advance of \$50,000. It was envisaged at the time of receiving this advance, that during the course of the following season we would be able to repay a substantial portion of this and had budgeted \$25,000 at the end of this season just finished.

However due to a number of major expenses incurred which we had not envisaged nor budgeted for in this season, this was not possible.

- Our required contribution for the Funding of the development of the training room downstairs, which totalled \$26,000. This was \$18,000 more than budgeted;
- The funding of the administration centre costs were over budget mainly to assist the change in officers during 2013-2014, but still down by 50 percent on last season;
- The write off of a bad debt of \$12,000;
- Lower then expected revenue from fundraising and special events.

The Foundation Committee has been advised of this and when the 2014-2015 Board is formed this will be discussed with them.

I wish the new Finance and Property Director all the best. The platform to take this Club forward has been set. And with the upstairs refurbishment going ahead and with good management this has the potential to give the Club a greater presence throughout the community and to be more financially secure.

What a year it has been patrolling at Kings Beach again this year. We have had a season full of both amazing sunny weather and not so wonderful weather over our weekends but once again we dealt with what was given and went about our job of Saving Lives! I'm happy to say once again that we have achieved no loss of life during the patrolling season this year at Kings Beach – well done to all of you for your efforts in achieving this.

Firstly I would like to thank all of the members of Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC for their hard work and dedication throughout the 2013-2014 season. I'm proud to say we patrolled for a total of 7858 hour this season, which is a fantastic effort. All of our patrolling members should be proud of this great achievement as this time is all volunteered to the club.

This year we have seen a decrease in our rescue statistics from 126 rescues in 2012/13 to 95 rescues in the 2013/14 season. The decrease in these statistics is a reflection of our hard work on the beach. We have shown a proactive approach with the public with positive preventative actions and good communication to ensure the public are swimming in between the red and yellow flags. With an increase of more than 10,000 extra people visiting our beach through this season, I am comfortable to say we are doing a fantastic job. I would also like to congratulate all members on their hard work when assisting with any of the rescues or incident we do attend and assist with. I would like to say a massive well done to the Flathead patrol team with the resuscitation of a 12-month baby after an incident on the beach where the child collided with another young boy on the beach. Without the great work by all these members on the day a successful outcome was achieved.

Again this year our 24 hour Response group has had another busy year with in excess of 7 after hour callouts to assist in incidents. Whist the patrol season may be finished this service runs year round. We were involved in the search for the missing tourist at Alexandra Bay in Noosa and have also responded to multiple callout to the Caloundra Bar and Pumicestone Passage to assist in boat incidents. I would like to thank all members that were involved with these callouts for there assistance.



Lifesaving

Once again we have had some great success this year with our fundraising and grant opportunities. The club has been successful in multiple grants, which has been fantastic. We have been able to provide 6 new digital radios this season along with a range of patrolling equipment, including soft rescue boards and helmets to enhance the safety of our members in the IRB. We have also been able to boost our training capabilities with a range of new equipment to provide better training facilities for up and coming SRC and Bronze members. With the success of a major "Get Playing" grant we have been able to provide a modern and up to date training room not only for the use of our committees but most importantly for the use of our members.

I would like to thank Tamara, Kirsten and all our amazing trainers, assessors and facilitators who have donated their time. Thank you for all your hard work and dedication this year in providing a massive increase in new and up skilled member. Without the hard work of these people we wouldn't have the patrol teams with the skilled members we have today. Not only can our members awards and knowledge be used whilst on the beach but their skill are also acknowledged outside of lifesaving as well.

In addition to the above numbers we were also busy assessing our nippers, with 213 Evaluations carried out on. Special thanks to Matt Richards and Alan Macklin for this.

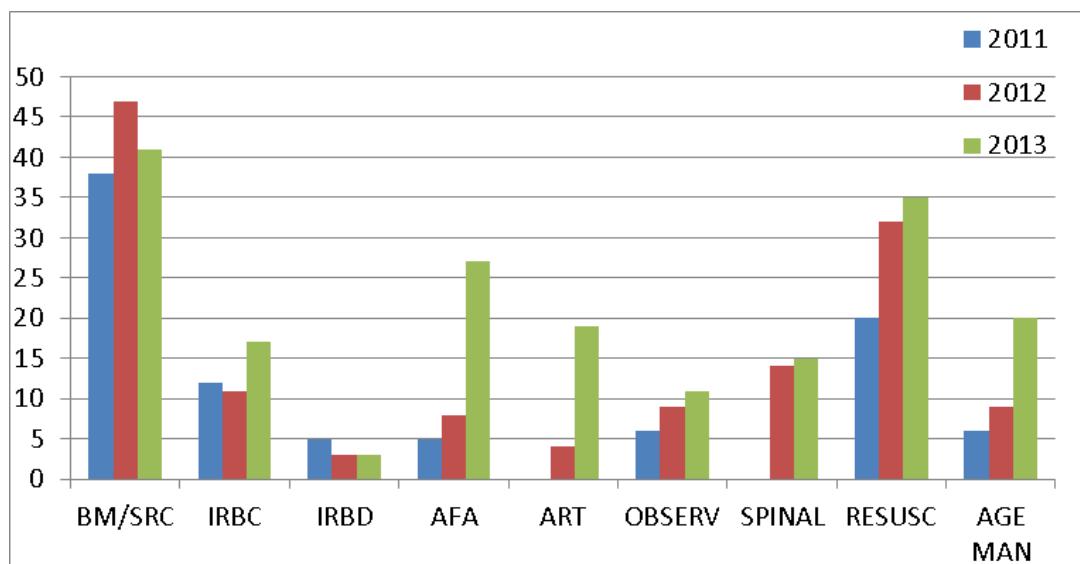

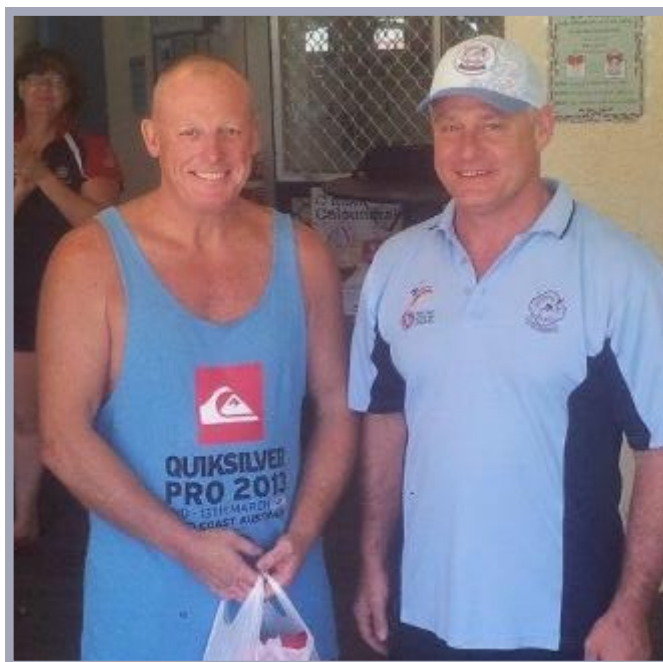

The U6s were doing the things that the U7s were doing and the U7s were chafing at the bit wanting to do what the U8s were doing. Every single Greencap had no fear of the water and could tell you which way the wind was coming from.

Throughout the season we had children participating in the Sunday Nipper program, attending Surf Sports training during the week and on weekends, competing at Carnivals, attending SRC courses and Nipper Camps. The attitude and the manner in which the children conducted themselves and contributed to all aspects of the Nipper program was impeccable.

In closing, I would like to extend a great big thank you to all the Nippers, their parents and volunteers. Every single person contributes in some way to the success of our Nipper program. We have had a fantastic year and I look forward to seeing you all again next season for an even better one.

Youth Development

Surf Sports



To say this season has been disappointing, from a surf sports perspective, is more than an understatement, it is an embarrassment. The loss of Rhett Collie as Head Coach and the ensuing exodus of competition members is something that will take a long time to recover from and whilst the growth of our U8 to U10 nippers puts a little light at the end of the tunnel, it remains a long dark tunnel.

Our representation at senior level, or lack of it, is testimony of the effect of undervaluing and dismissing an established coaching program that, in the 2012/13 season consisted of 18 regular training attendees in the open category (U15 to Open) with almost 700 training sessions between them, 2 Nutri-Grain competitors and an Aussie medallist, to this season of 9 training attendees with under 200 sessions attended and none of that age group competing

at Branch, State or Aussies in water events. As current head water coach, I accept some of the responsibility for this dismal performance, but we must also acknowledge the fact that it is hard to keep motivated to train when the inspiration and support is cut from underneath you.

Sadly, this seems to be accepted, not just within our Club, but widely across the whole association. Where once the surf lifesaving movement was held in high public esteem and our members were seen as bronzed Aussie heroes who risked their lives to protect the general bathing public with basic equipment, relying largely on their fitness and surf skills and that of their fellow members, we have become an over governed bureaucracy who are more concerned about red tape and paperwork and would rather not see someone step out of their comfort zone or take the slightest risk, if it meant stepping into the slightest form of a dangerous situation, for fear of litigation. In 1948 there was a fatal shark attack at Kings Beach, it was outside patrol hours but 2 Met Caloundra members swam to the aid of the victim. I wonder if our current members would be encouraged to risk their lives in such a manner now? To that end we are accepting a less than ideal standard of proficiency amongst our members. We operate in an uncontrolled environment and should be training for the worst possible scenario, how can we do that if we are not allowed to take risks? I realise my views won't be shared by the majority of other board members and stress that they are entirely my views. I hold these views because I have had a long and thoroughly enjoyable association with the movement and hate to see its image diminished. It is up to our members to decide if they agree with me or not and whatever others think of my views I will continue to do my utmost to coach our younger members to gain confidence in a surf environment, to achieve a high level of competency and most of all enjoyment in that environment, for as long as I am needed and able.

Surf Sports

I was once told by a coach to look at life through the front windscreen, not through the rear view mirror. So looking to the future, I have based the main focus of my coaching program on the development of our younger nipper age groups and retention of our U14, 15, and 17 age groups and with the help of Paul Bounty, Phill Ashworth, Tony Heugh and Carl Perkins as assistant coaches and countless other nipper parents who gave up their time to do water safety. I believe we are headed in a positive direction with these goals. The evidence of this was encouraging with this year's nipper camp being a great success and my thanks goes out to all who assisted me with this of which there were many but in particular Tammy Sheppard who put a lot of time, effort and finances into organising the rash singlets that were unique and amazing.

Our nippers and masters competed at a number of carnivals this year with some pleasing results and improving performances but most importantly a lot of enjoyment. To list the results of all the carnivals would take too much space in this already too long report, but I need to make special mention of our highlights which came mostly from the beach arena of which I must admit I have very little to do with so credit to the beach coaches.

These boys didn't get to race this season due to a number of different reasons but are keen for season 2014-15. Open Women Leftovers Claire Chapman, Shannon Grimsey, Kylie Zijp and Fi Fewtrell. The George Bass marathon over 180Km would be a true test of their endurance and will.

Surfers Paradise Navy round 1 was a short course event where the gate cans became the turning cans. This was a complete shock to the system as both crews had been doing a fair bit of long work in the boat. This showed in the results, reserve grade men and open women both crew failed to make finals. ASRL Triple Crown round 1 on the following day was the complete opposite. We sort and were granted Surf Life Saving Queensland Approval and we received a Grant for 80% of the funding from the Queensland Government Department of Sport and Recreation. Our Club Grant Officers, Ken O'Connell and Alan Macklin were able to work with Matthew Fitzpatrick from Momentum and our Club's Architect, Brand & Slater,

to successfully identify and apply for this grant. ishing off the work downstairs as well as past members Corey Macklin and Corey Jones. The painting and tiling in the Male Dorms looks great boys, thank you.

Stage 1 of the downstairs refurbishment is now completed and we are eagerly planning Stage 2. If you haven't already had a look downstairs, I encourage you now to pop in and view the fantastic transformation when you are next at the Club. Please see below a copy of the total expenses for the project and where the funds were sourced. Thank you must go to the Sport and Recreation Department of the Queensland Government for their assistance in helping to fund this project.

Last year we commissioned a Landscape Concept Plan from the Kings Beach Redevelopment Landscape Architect, Guymer Bailey for an area in the south east Corner of our Clubhouse for what we are calling Celebration Place. This will include a timber deck at the end of Spender Lane attached to our Clubhouse within our new lease and a reclaimed area just adjacent on Council Lease for the purpose of Public Weddings and Members Memorials. We were fortunate to once again have our local divisional member, Councillor Tim Dwyer, come to the party and assist us with this.

We must also thank Councillor Tim and the local Council Officers from the Sunshine Coast Regional Council for all of their assistance and co-operation this last year in attaining the renewal of our Lease and the all of the other work that we have in train with them. Without them our community organisation would certainly not prosper and grow to provide the level of service that Caloundra enjoys to this very day.

We have a 20 year lease now, so we can seek finance to refurbish the Supporters Club upstairs. Thank

you, Craig Spender for all of your hard negotiating, patience and continued support for making the new lease a reality. As a result of this lease, Craig has been able to successfully apply for a Commercial Loan with Westpac Banking Corporation. The Surf Club Board of Management has requested that the Supporters Club take on this loan in the Supporters Club name, even though the asset of the Clubhouse and all of the new refurbishment work will remain an asset of the Surf Club. The Surf Club BOM felt that the responsibility to make the repayments will be on the Supporters Club, so it should have the loan in the Supporters Club name. The Supporters Club BOM have accepted this responsibility.

Initial approval has been given by SLSQ for the Supporters Club refurbishment, pending successful sourcing and signing of the finance documents. Once these loan documents have been signed, then final SLSQ approval will be sort.

Active Member Approval has been given at the Special General Meeting last year for the Supporters Club Refurbishment and the setting up of a Kiosk in the Pavilion. Plans have been finalised by Brand & Slater Architects, finishes have been finalised in consultation with the relevant staff and Secretary Manager of the Supporters Club, Melissa Brooke. Contracts have been signed with Open Projects for both projects after recommendation from Brand & Slater Architects. Another big thank you must go to Craig Spender for his work with the local Council in negotiating the Community Lease for the Pavilion which included abiding by the Heritage requirements for the building.

We very much appreciate the contribution that Brand & Slater Architects have given our Club. Whilst we may not have been able to go to a full tender process with finalised plans and schedule of finishes, we have been able to achieve what we normally wouldn't be able achieve because of their extreme generosity. The downside of this is that we haven't been able to give our local builders and sub-contractors a crack at the work. We had no formal tender documents for them to quote on. It was Brand & Slater's recommendation that we contract Open Projects to design the kitchen and quote on their concept plans using Open Projects own Stainless Steel fabrication and cabinet making workshops. This has saved us a great deal on architect fees.

Next time we will be working a little different with the architects, so we can offer the work to our local building contractors, but we realise that it will cost us a great deal more. If any member is interested in viewing the cost savings that we managed to achieve this time around, I would be happy to discuss this matter further with them. For obvious reasons, I am reluctant to advertise these details in this document.

The construction time for the Supporters Club Refurbishment Stage 1 is 14 weeks and once the loan documents have been signed and lodged with the solicitors, Open Projects would be ready to commence work. At the time of writing this report, a tentative commencement date is Monday 2nd June 2014 with a completion on Friday 5th September 2014. This will hopefully have us set for the start of next season and ready for the September school holidays that commence on Friday 19th September 2014.

At that point in time we will be introducing our new trading name, "Mets on Kings" that was approved at the last Supporters Club AGM. A big thank you must go to Kara Macklin for her assistance in helping us with a professional design for our new logo. The Supporters Club BOM have been working on this for quite some time and the final draft will be proposed to our members for ratification at the next Supporters Club AGM.

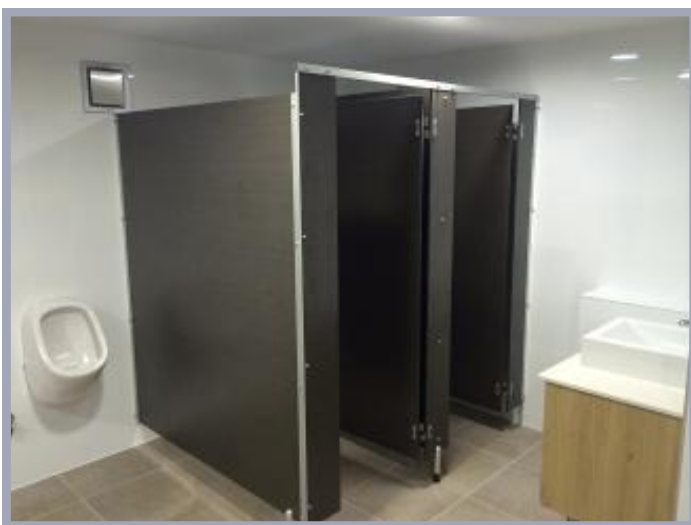

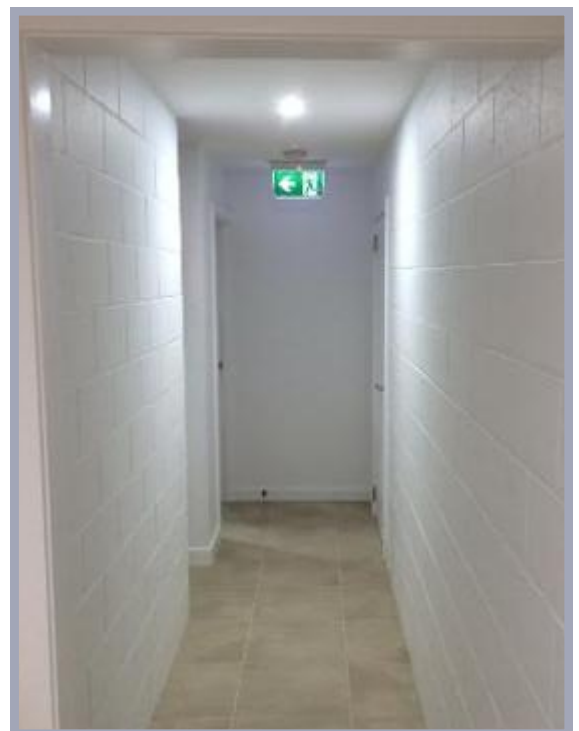

While there is still a "mountain to climb" in terms of the work required to bring the whole renovation initiative to fruition, we are confident the finished product will be one of which you can all be proud and which will profoundly improve the image and financial capacity of both clubs in years to come.

Speaking of financials, as I write this report the final numbers for the year are not yet available, but we anticipate a modest profit from our trading operations. Given the aging facilities at our disposal, this is a great credit to Melissa (our club manager) and her whole team.

Under difficult circumstances and in a less than robust economic climate, the supporters club has continued to contribute funding to the surf club not only in cash, but through significant in-kind support. Combined, the monthly donations and in-kind contributions total more than \$25,000 for the year.

In concluding this report, I'd like to pay tribute to some unsung but nonetheless, greatly appreciated contributors.

Firstly to my fellow board members, Alan Macklin, John Buchanan, Glen Forbes, Jeff Morris, Paul Bounty, Mike McDonald and Melissa Brooke, - I offer my sincere thanks and gratitude for your contributions, your energy and your dogged commitment. It's been a privilege to work with you!

In particular, I'd like to acknowledge the efforts of Alan Macklin (who also serves as chair of the build-

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2014

Note 1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Queensland). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

(a) Income Tax

The Club has received an exemption from income tax in accordance with Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

(c) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

(d) Employee Provisions

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(e) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(f) Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(g) Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(h) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

(j) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

(k) Accounts payable and other payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

At a Special General Meeting held in April, 2013, approval was provided by members to provide financial support to the Supporters Club, in relation to obtaining bank funding for the development of the Supporters Club to a maximum of \$880,000.


